The competition was designed to showcase outstanding research at the undergraduate level. Any student from First Year or Second Year Degree College who is a bonafide undergraduate student from any University was eligible to compete. Work done in group (maximum 5 students) or individually by the student/s was accepted for the competition.

The competition was conceptualized with the following objectives:

To provide:

- The opportunity to share their research ideas and results at a special forum that provides visibility for their work
- A platform to interact with attendees to share ideas, gain new insights and understand possible practical applications
- Constructive feedback about their research and presentation, from a panel of distinguished judges from industry and academia
- Recognize and reward outstanding student research

Entries were received through online mode (Google forms).

The <u>participation fees</u> were as follows:

In house students: Rs. 50/- per participant

Entries from other colleges: Rs. 2400/- per project inclusive of GST

Fees for delegates:

Individual student delegates: Rs. 200/- in cash

Faculty delegates: Rs. 750/- in cash

- o Content Process (Rationale & Purpose, review of literature, objective/s, methodology, result and discussion)
- o Interdisciplinary approach
- Relevance to current situation /application of the research / Significance/contribution of the research to society
- o Presentation skills (Visual and Oral presentation)
- Ability to answer queries/ questions
- Overall impact
- o The decision of the judges was considered to be final

The teams were allotted codes so as to not reveal their identity during presentation. A time slot of 7 min was provided to each group. Two members from each group were allowed to present their PowerPoint presentation, whereas, all members participated in the question and answer session at the end of each presentation. All the judges shared their feedback at the end of the program. They appreciated the work done by the students, pointed out lacunae and provided suggestions for further work.

The valedictory function began at 4pm. The Chief Guest for the occasion was Dr. Rashmi Oza, Dean of Interdisciplinary studies, University of Mumbai. The program began with the lighting of the lamp. Dr. Geeta Ibrahim, Principal, College of Home Science, Nirmala Niketan presented a token of appreciation to Dr. Oza and also introduced her to the gathering.
