Each One Teach One:

Each one teach one is a motivation for the educated class to understand their moral and social responsibility to teach at least one illiterate person, makes a big difference in society. Ever since the pandemic hit, it hasn't been easy for anyone. May it be the frontline worker or head of the department and so on? But one thing the pandemic has taught is that life is uncertain and that one can lose our loved ones in a blink of an eye. Invoking consumer awareness. Menstrual health and hygiene.

Taking Basic English Grammar sessions for the kid facing difficulties, etc. After conducting these sessions, the feedback was collected.

It was an amazing experience. At the beginning it was challenging to cover the topic which is related to math's (calculation) that to in Marathi but it went smoothly. Student enjoyed teaching it to her target group. She was happy that the knowledge she shared with Mrs. Khopkar is useful to her and she is happy about it. Even after the session she is continuing with her daily entries of income and expense and to do list. Mrs. Khopkar was so happy with the session that she even asked the student to help one of her colleague with same session and she even said that the way I taught her math's calculation was so easy to understand that anyone can do it. At the end she even suggested that she should take math's classes.

21. EXAMINATION WORK**22. EXTENSION ACTIVITIES/ INDUSTRIAL VISIT:****Extension Activities****a. KARAJGAON RURAL CAMP**

Gnanajyoti Community College, located at Patilpada Karajgaon, Palghar district is managed by the Nirmala Niketan Institute. Sr. Clera Gonsalves is the in-charge of the College. The college caters to the Warli tribal youth. The Warlis are an indigenous tribe or Adivasis living in mountainous as well as coastal areas of the Maharashtra-Gujarat border and surrounding areas. They have their own animistic beliefs, life, customs, and traditions. The Warli language is a dialect spoken by this tribe.

Sixteen students and two faculty members Dr. Roopa Rao & Ms. Saniya Pai from the Department of Community Resource Management, College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan, and Mumbai – 20 visited the Gnanajyoti Community College from 23rd to 24th March 2022. The group planned and organized various skill-building as well as knowledge-filled sessions for the sixty-four students of the community college. The planning and rehearsing began on the 7th of March 2022. Marathi-speaking students from the department opted to participate and gain practical skills. Six sessions including the feedback session were planned. Students were divided into groups and each group was delegated the responsibility to handle one session each.

The group boarded the Gujarat Super-fast Express to Umbergam in Gujarat State on 23rd March 2022 at 5.45 am from Mumbai Central station. Local transportation – autorickshaw was taken to reach the interior rural area located at Patilpada, Karajgaon. The sisters (Sr. Clera Gonsalves, Sr. Shirley, Sr. Ramila Dodhia, and Sr. Mary Colaco) were very happy to welcome the group of students at 8.00 am. After breakfast, the group attended the assembly and were then taken around for a facility tour by Sr. Mary. She also oriented the group to the work of the community college.

The ‘Warli Art Centre’ located on the ground floor of the college building, provides skill-based training to the local womenfolk. It exhibits the Warli painted artifacts such as kurtas, stoles, bags, handkerchiefs, cups/mugs, and home décor accessories. Once the group settled, they started organizing the community college hall for the icebreaker session. The tables were laid, floor mats for the students were placed and the LCD projector – laptop connected. The excited group was anxiously waiting to start the session at 10.00 am.

The participants from the Community college as well as the sisters appreciated the efforts put in to organize the session. Sr. Clera specifically mentioned that she liked the meticulously planned 2-day coursework. Gifts were distributed to the most active participant and also to those participants who did not receive any gifts on the previous day.

The participants appreciated the skill-building sessions specifically and the games. They also were very happy with the multiple gifts that they got during the two days. Two students (Fatema Motiwala and Sakina Sadriwala) were in-charge of the gifts and had an account of it all. Students enthusiastically had started collecting relevant gifts two weeks in advance, The collected gifts/goodies were sorted and packed as per the sessions by the two in-charge students. They gift-wrapped the gifts using old wrappers as well as newspapers and placed them in different boxes. Rich/good

saris and dresses/trousers were separated and gift-wrapped for teachers and other staff. Five carton boxes were filled with gifts and the student group was excited about having collected them all. The 3 days sessions conducted were very much appreciated by the sisters and all the participants. Motivational and team building games were organized to build good repo and interaction between the participants and students. Moreover it was a fun bonding activity for everyone. This led to activity being very fun and competitive as per their reviews, this activity taught them how to work well in teams and coordinate. This also showed their unity as they were motivating each other to win too.

The participants enjoyed the music and danced in the center of the ground on the music. This was just a fun activity so that they could loosen up by dancing and become more casual with our students, which would benefit us with their honest reviews about us. Conducting this activity and seeing all participants so happy dancing and enjoying the music made everyone the happiest! Students were eagerly waiting and looking for such opportunities in the future. Games were organized and curated by Miss Disha Maroly.

A self-defence workshop was organized by Fatema.R.K.Kanchwala. The workshop started with a few exercises to energize the body. It was conducted with a group of 92 students who were staying in the college hostel itself. The session was conducted with help of few student volunteers Michelle, Disha, Sania, Waasifa, Bhavya, Stency, Vanessa, Blencina, Juveriya, Saloni, Sakina, Anchal, Aishwariya and Esha. 10.30 - 12.30 PM Envelope making workshop was conducted by Aishwarya Pololoo. Student volunteers were Juveriya, Esha, Aishwarya Saloni , Bhavya, Vanessa, Waasifa, Umaima, Priyanka, and Priya. Students were divided in two groups. Four different types of envelopes were taught, Simple Envelopes with mandala art and different other techniques of decorations, decorative Envelopes were demonstrated and taught. Materials for making envelopes were purchased from Mumbai .All the extra materials were left for the participants to practice in future. The participants were very

enthusiastic while making the Envelopes. They came up with very creative ideas of decorating the Envelopes. The girls enjoyed the session very much. The workshop ended at 12.15 p.m with positive feedback.

1.30- 4.00 PM Purse making Workshop was conducted by Miss Aanchal Tiwari. Student volunteers were Anchal, Nusaiba, Nidhi, Umaima, Blencina, Shofia, Bhavya, Sakina, Priyanka, Priya .The session was on Easy DIY purse which can be made up of minimum costs like old bed sheets/cloth, thin cardboard, fabric glue, Velcro and needle and thread.

88 participant were divided in 8 groups and 2 participants worked in pairs and learnt the procedure of making purse. They all enjoyed the workshop thoroughly. It was a learning experience for our students also where they learnt the importance of team building, patience, Creativity. The interaction between the two groups was extremely satisfactory .Every student enjoyed teaching and learning .The Participants were very keen on learning new things and were even very excited. Participant's concentration was immense and they made note of each and every steps that was being demonstrated for future reference. The session wined at 4.30PM

4.15 - 5.15 PM Consumer Awareness (Food Adulteration) Workshop: This was the Fourth workshop of the day conducted by the students Miss Stency and Miss Waasifa.They introduced the topic to the participants where they spoke about how important it is to know about the quality of the food and spices we are consuming and to what extent they are safe for us. Information was given regarding food poisoning and how it can be caused by simple mistake as well such as negligence, overeating, and not maintaining proper hygiene and how it disrupts our immune system. Information was provided about misleading practices taking place in market and Vendors and shopkeepers cheat their customers and make profit. Importance of reading labels and checking dates of packaging and expiry before buying and consuming anything was also explained. Participants were also told about the TFM (total fatty matter) contents in soap about how much is required in washing soaps and how much is required in bathing soaps and how advertisements mislead us and we must not believe and take everything we see and hear.

Miss Vanessa and Miss Stency then demonstrated simple home techniques to detect adulterants in spices also to detect its purity and how can we identify spices and herbs if they are non-adulterated or a carbon copy of it.The techniques were very simple where all materials used to detect adulterants are easily available in home kitchens.

5.30 - 7 .30 PM Dream Catcher Workshop conducted by Sakina Kherodawala. It was the Fifth and last workshop of the day. Student volunteers were Sakina Kherodawal, Priya Pathak, Priyanka Shinde, Umaima Dahodwala, Bhavya Gala 'This workshop was conducted to make Participants aware how a decorative item can be made with simple things which are available easily and can be sold in the market easily. This activity also helped them to show case their talents and creativity. Materials used were bangle, wool and colored papers. Students also taught them various shapes / designs of

dream catcher like star, flower, diamond, etc. Participants were asked to make their own designs. They made various kind of designs and decorated it with pearls, papers, feathers, etc. They were so much excited to make and they even said they will hang it on their window and in the end the activity went successful their dream catcher they made came out to be the most beautiful and neat work. Indeed, it was joyful and a fruitful workshop for them as well as US.

On the final day of departure a dance workshop was organised by our student Michelle Fernandez. from 7am to 9am. All the sisters of the community college also participated in this workshop. The session was attended by 92 students all staying at the community college. The student volenteres were Fatema, Disha, Sania, Waasifa, Bhavya, Stency, Vanessa, Blencina, Juveriya, Saloni, Sakina, Anchal, Aishwariya and Esha. The song selected to teach them was Tumi ho Bandu, it's a Semi Classical style, of dance form. This dance form requires a lot understanding of the postures, having a strong core and having self-discipline. The session went on for 2 hours. Michelle also explained how they could come up with their own new steps and taught them the basic counting of dance steps. In the end Michelle shot a video with them dancing to the whole section of the song.

A group picture was clicked and the students of the community college gave us a vote of thanks and we gave them a few gifts and headed down for Breakfast. It was very enlightening for every one as our students got to learn many things from them such as punctuality, obedience, mannerism, team spirit, enthusiasm, discipline, how to be well organized and be grateful and appreciate little things in life and be satisfied with all the things God has blessed us with.

OCER recruitment is done on an annual basis Open access days at The Oberoi, Mumbai. On being selected through the OCER recruitment process, students are offered a position as an operation assistant in one of the four operational departments:

The SDP aims to familiarize the participants with techniques for cracking the selection process of top companies. The methodology of SDP involves a combination of lectures and some practical sessions with greater emphasis on giving participants with Hands-on Experience. The SDP trained participants in: Aptitude/Logical reasoning, Verbal Ability, Marketing Management, and Communication. This training will also help students crack competitive exams such as CAT/ MAT/ Bank- PO, etc.
