EXTENSION WORK- Bharuch (31st March to 1st April 2022)

Department of Textile and Fashion Technology has always strived to give the students enriching experiences, learning and immense exposure in terms of practical knowledge and skill through extension work. This year the MSc I and MSc II had gone to Bharuch for 2 days. The journey started at 05:45 am by 22953 - Gujarat Express from Mumbai Central on the 31st March, 2022. There were in all 18 students accompanied by 2 staff members, Head of the Department, Dr. Pratima Goyal and Mrs. Sanghmitra Navalgund. The group reached Bharuch at 10:58 am and boarded auto-rickshaws to reach, Vidyadeep Community Centre, Bharuch.

There were 88 inhouse students who had enrolled for various courses like Nursing, Office Management, Gruhani, etc. The students of Vidyadeep Community Centre stay in the hostel as most of them are from tribal area in and around Bharuch. The Principal – Sister Asha, Sister Shaily, Sister Laveena, and Sister Janet and the students warmly welcomed us.



After freshening up, the students had light snacks and proceeded to the hall to conduct the session. The students of the centre were divided into 18 groups of 5 to 6 in each group. In the first session Block printing technique was taught. The trainees were given instruction on how to make the printing paste, how to develop padding for the printing table, the technique of block printing, etc. After brief introduction, hands-on experience was given to the students. Beautiful block printed samples were created by the trainees and the joy in their eyes was unfathomable.

After lunch break a session of tie and dye was conducted. Brief introduction was given regarding the techniques of tie and dye and the dyeing process. Each trainee was given one ready-to-dye sample on which they did different tying technique that they learnt followed by the dyeing process. Double colour dyeing technique was taught. Meanwhile when the dyeing process was going on the students of Department of Textile and Fashion Technology presented beautiful PowerPoint created by them about Tie and Dye and Block printing. Once the dyeing was done the samples were collected by the trainees and untied. The sparkle in their eyes was unmeasurable when they say beautiful effects of the tie and dyed sample.

At the end of the day the trainees were introduced to basic embroidery stitches to be used for the applique work, so that they could practice and come for the session to be held next day. Post dinner a cultural exchange program was held where the trainees presented Tarpa - the traditional tribal dance and our students and staff joined them in the celebration. It was a well spent time full of dance and music, after a fruitful teaching – learning session during the day.

Day 2, after breakfast we gathered for the morning session. Blessings of the lord were invoked with beautiful rhythmic prayers, sung by the trainees. In this session the trainers taught Applique work. Creative designs were cut out from colourful fabrics and appliqued on a white poplin material using different stitches taught on the previous day. The PPT for applique work was presented by the trainers. Trainees were now asked to get their own garments or stoles on which they did block printing.

At the end of the extension work, a small exhibition was put up where the trainees displayed the articles prepared by them. The students of community centre and ours shared their experience and learning from the sessions held.
