ACTIVITIES OF THE SOCIAL SERVICE COMMITTEE

Eye Check Up Camp

The student volunteers along with the faculty members of the Social Service Committee of the college, organised a free eye check up camp on 22.4.2014 from 12-2.30 pm. for people from economically backward classes.

Dr.Navin Gupta, an eye specialist checked the patients. Around 130 persons including hawkers, vendors, scavengers, support staff from our college, college of social work and class IV employees of nearby offices benefitted from the camp.

Some were diagnosed with minor problems and were given free medication. 15 persons were prescribed spectacles that were sponsored by a donor who wishes to be undisclosed. All of them were given the spectacles on the 30th of April. Six patients required cataract surgery. The lions club has agreed to sponsor the same and the matter is in process.

The eye check up camp was a huge success!!!

Thalassemia Awareness Session

An awareness session on Thalassemia was held on 25th April 2014 from 9:00-11:00am. An eminent expert Dr. Dhanunjaya Sarnath, a molecular oncologist and professor at College of Science, NMIMS was the speaker of the day. She explained to the audience about the types, causes, consequences of Thalassemia and also the need for prevention of the disease. She explained the genetic abnormalities and the prevalence of this disease in India.

Around 50 students eagerly listened to the talk. The students understood the seriousness of the disease and were ready to enlighten others about the same, thus helping to reduce the prevalence of this disease in India.

The TYBSc group visited Comet Media Foundation at Fort on 18th January, 2014. Seminars:

Sports Textiles, organized jointly with Wool Research Association:

A half day seminar on Sports textiles was organized jointly in association with Wool Research Association, Thane on 2nd January 2014, in the college premises. The speakers for the seminar included Dr. Mrinal Choudhari, the Deputy Director WRA, Ms. Amrita from Kusumgar Corporates, Mr. Mayur Basuk, Mr. Amit Sengupta, and Mr. Shishir Tyagi all scientists from WRA. The faculty of the specialization was present along with the students of the T.Y.B.Sc., M.Sc. I & II. Dr. Mrinal Choudhari gave a talk on "A Review on Technical Textiles". She briefed about the various aspects of this topic and covered the meaning of technical textiles along with their twelve categories, viz. Agrotech, Buildtech, Clothtech, Geotech, Hometech, Indutech, Meditech, Mobiltech, Oekotech, Packtech, Protech and Sportech.

Ms. Amrita from Kusumgar Corporates informed the contribution of her organization in the field of technical textiles and stressed upon the fact that her company was the pioneer of the technical textiles in India. Mr. Amit Sengupta spoke on "Sportech – Needs, Challenges & Prospects". He highlighted the basic requirements that are necessary for a textile to be included as a sportech. These are namely Comfort, Smart Functionality, Light Weight and Safety Features. He explained that textiles are used as Sportech in three separate categories, viz. Sportswear, Sports goods and Sport accessories. Mr. Mayur Basuk gave an "Overview of Indian Sporting Goods & Equipment

Industry". He highlighted the little known facts about the industry and told that the Indian Sports Goods Industry is among the largest sports goods manufacturers in Asia after China and Japan. It is one of the largest producers of footballs

Color Event organized jointly with Society of Dyers & Colorists:

A half day seminar on Color Event was jointly organized with the Society of Dyers and Colorists on the 28th January 2014 in the college premises. The seminar was attended by more than 200 participants including students (F.Y.B.Sc., S.Y.B.Sc., T.Y.B.Sc. and M.Sc. I and II), Alumni of the college, parents of our students, members from industry, SDC Members, Faculty and students of other Institutions such as B. D. Somani, NIFT, SASMIRA etc. The event was sponsored completely by the Society of Dyers and Colorists for which the expenses towards snacks and printing was Rs. 10,000. The Seminar began with lighting of lamp by dignitaries Dr. S. Kamat –Vice President Industrial products and solutions, KITL; Mr. U. Nimkar, President SDC EC; Mr. Y. Gaikwad, CEO SDC EC; Dr. Akshata Bajpeyee, Member of SDC; Ms. P. Khan, Administrator of the college; Principal Dr. P. Machado and Dr. E. Dedhia, Head of Specialization. Dr. Dedhia welcomed the guests and gave an introduction about the college and specialization. A brief of SDC was given by Dr. Akshata Bajpeyee, Member of SDC.

The talks were presented by well known personalities from the Textile Industry. Dr. Kamat spoke on "Advances in Pigment Printing and Ink jet Printing" and showed samples of digitally printed fabrics. Mr. Gaikwad shared information on "Color". Dr. Kamat enlightened us about the new development- the Dyestone Colorants made by Matsui International. This was followed by explaining the drawbacks of the various types of binders available in the market. He highlighted the importance of pigment printing and said that in spite of all the draw-backs pigment printing occupies a very dominant role in printing because of the versatility of the process, coupled with the advantage of ease in application and low water consumption.

In next session on inkjet printing he explained the difference between digital and ink jet printing. He explained the process of ink jet printing, certain technical terms and essential elements of this method. Dr. Kamat highlighted problems that could be encountered during the process. He concluded the advantages and disadvantages of this process. He urged the young designers to explore its application on all kinds of textiles and assured that though it is a tool for designers to create new possibilities, it cannot fully replace the existing traditional printing techniques.

Visits:

Wool Research Association:

A one-day visit was organized on 4th, January 2014 for staff and students of TY B.Sc., M.Sc. part I and M.Sc. part II to WRA, Thane. Ms. Mrinal Chaudhary, Deputy Director, Textile Design & Color Dept., WRA extended a warm welcome to all students and staff.

There was a brief presentation about WRA, major activities, functions and research projects of WRA delivered by Ms. Mrinal followed by visit to different departments of WRA. The students were divided into 4 separate groups and each group was accompanied by staff and a WRA research scientist. All groups visited WRA testing laboratories like Chemical mechanical processing unit, eco analysis lab, textile designing lab, textile technology lab, textile testing lab and recently constructed sports textiles lab. The visit to WRA gave students and staff opportunity to understand and observe the latest testing equipments/ machineries functioning and their testing

procedures including those for technical textiles. The overall visit was enriching and informative. The visit was well organized with the lunch and tea organized by WRA. Students of the specialization expressed their gratitude to the organizers.

Extension Work:

T.Y.B.Sc: Extension work in collaboration with Sneha foundation

The extension work was organized for the T.Y B.Sc. students from 11th January 2014 to 22nd January 2014 with the help of Sneha foundation. The aim of the extension work was to instill values of sharing and helping the underprivileged society. The students visited the centre (Sneha foundation, Dharavi) on Saturdays from 2.00 to 4.30 pm. The ladies were very happy to see the students and also took interest in talking to them. The number of ladies ranged from around 10 to 16 in numbers over the 3 Saturdays. Various products taught were tray cover, puppets, hangings made of cloth, paper bags and embellishing them using different embroidery stitches. The overall experience was learning and enriching. Also, students were involved in making and developing products out of waste fabric available in college which is planned to be given away in charity. It was also a time for interactive bonding between students and faculty. It has been an enriching learning experience for all involved.

Community Resource Management

• **Hotel Internship:** As a part of the coursework the students of Hotel Front Office and Housekeeping Elective have to undergo a 3-week industry placement program. These are temporary positions within hotels that allow the students to gain practical experience by working alongside professionals. They also get the opportunity to apply the knowledge and skills learned through classroom learning in real-life situations. This hands-on experience allows them to make more informed decisions about the career path they will opt for following the graduation program.

The students were trained through various teaching learning methods such as role plays, case studies, powerpoint presentations, videos from the industry, newspaper article discussion to equip them professionally for the industry. They were asked to shortlist three five/four-star properties and contact the human resource managers to seek opportunity for an interview. Before the interview the students were asked to research the hotel thoroughly and be aware of their key markets and currents trends so that they could face the interview knowledgeably. The specialization is very proud of its students and their achievement in acquiring internship program at the following prominent hotels in Mumbai city:

Dr. Kamath, secretary of C.G.S.I gave an introductory lecture on Rights of consumer, more emphasis was laid on "Consumer is a King". The session ended with interaction between the members of Air tell and Loop Mobile.
- **CRM Market** A CRM Market 'Spring dale' was organized by the students of TYCRM on 31st of January and 1st of February 2013. The theme for the market was "Colours". Since the subject Marketing Management and Entrepreneurship does not have a practical hence the annual CRM Market. Market was a practical application of concepts learned by the students in the subject. The students were involved in planning for the market from September 2013. The students were divided into 9 groups and each group had a trading and a food stall. With the inflation in the market from the planning stage to execution stage, the students got a chance to work under unforeseen circumstances. A sense of cost- conscious was developed by the students and they learned measures to increase profit by reducing cost of the product and not increasing it. Market made a total profit of Rs. 22, 540/-. It was a great achievement for the Specialization as the Profit was more than the amount of Rs. 15, 940/- which was the profit of the previous year's CRM market.
- A Guest Lecture on 'Accounting and Bookkeeping' was organized for the students of TYCRM on 28th of February from 2:30 to 5:30 pm, 2014. The resource person invited was Ms. Shahana Khan, a Lecturer from Patuck College of Commerce.
- OCLD/OCER: The management training programs at Oberoi Centre of Learning and Development (OCLD) is ranked as among the best in Asia and a benchmark for international excellence within the hotel industry. This year ten students from of the Hotel Front Office and Housekeeping Elective were keen to join the OCLD/OCER program. After two full days of rigorous interviews, panel discussions & group discussions four students were offered placements through the OCER program.

Activity report of M.Sc. (Home Science) Part I & II – Food Processing and Preservation

• 10th January, 2014- 1st National Dietetics Day Celebration

The 1st National Dietetics Day was celebrated at the college on 10th of January, 2014. Several activities were planned by the Diet Counseling Cell of our college. 'On the spot essay writing competition' was arranged as well. Around 39 students from PG Dietetics, FYBSc, MSc FPP (Sem I), MSc FND (Sem I) and TYBSc participated in the competition. Students were asked to express their thoughts using their creative writing skills in a 1000 word essay on the topic 'The future of dietetics/ fitness/ food industry in the next fifty years!'

• 5-6th January, 2014- Industrial Visit to Pune

The students of Semester II visited **Gowardhan Cheese Factory** in Pune where they were shown the process of milking, cheese making, packaging and preparation of various gourmet cheese varieties. Next the students visited the **Morde Chocolate Factory.** They were shown processing of coffee beans and making of cooking chocolate. They also got firsthand experience to the application of HACCP principles within a processing plant.

The students also observed how Ryle's tube feeds are prepared, the administration of feeds via RT and JT. They also visited surgery, endocrine and nephrology wards.

At Jupiter Hospital the students again were shown Food Service Management, Ward Management and OPD Patient Management in a private hospital. They were also shown the staff canteen managed by an outsourced firm. They were shown the software used to prepare diet sheets and diet orders in the diet department of the hospital.

VOTER EDUCATION

An Awareness Session on 'Voter Education' was held at the College of Home Science, Nirmala Niketan on the 2^{nd} of April 2014, in association with Action for good Governance and Networking in India (**AGNI**).

The need for the session was felt as most of the students would be exercising their vote for the first time. This session was conducted by Mr. Sharad Kumar, AGNI Trustee and Editor of *Mumbai Meri Jaan*. The information was imparted through an attractive power point presentation.

This included the new recommendation issued by the Honourable Supreme Court NOTA (None of the above) button on the EVM for the welfare of voters, which empowers and enables them to disapprove of all the candidates in the electoral fray. Information was also given on The Election Watch Reporter (EWR) which is an interesting software application available on all Android cell phones and helps citizens to send complaints about violations of Electoral code or over expenditure during campaigns as well as any illegal activity related to polling. This software includes the facility of uploading photographs along the location indicator and sending it to the National Election Watch (NEW) who manages this application and then forwards it to Officials of the Election Commission of India keeping the senders identity hidden. Mr. Kumar also informed us about the recent ruling of the Honourable Supreme Court to bar candidates with criminal records that has also proven to be a shot in the arm for voters. He also spoke on the Association of Democratic Reform (ADR), that makes it mandatory for all candidates to file affidavits regarding their educational qualifications, assets and criminal records if any. This is then recorded in a format that is easy to refer to for voters before they cast their ballot. The session ended with doubts of the students being clarified.

It was truly an enlightening session and will definitely prepare each of us to vote with more deliberation, so that we get the representatives we need and deserve- those who can really serve the nation and her people and make India a country where each and every citizen is important.

ELECTION WATCH DUTY

The College of Home Science was privileged to collaborate with the Collector and the District Election Officer in conducting the recent Elections to the Lok Sabha 2014.

17 Teaching Staff, 4 Non-Teaching Staff and 7 Support Staff were deputed for 3 days of Intensive Training prior to the Election Day.

Teaching Staff were appointed as Presiding Officer, Assistant Presiding Officer or Polling Officer while Non-Teaching and Support Staff were entrusted with clerical duties.

All were required to be present in their respective polling stations from the previous evening and were expected to remain there after the polling till the ballot boxes were collected from their booths.
