### 8. EXTENSION ACTIVITIES/ Industrial Visit:

#### A. DEPARTMENT LEVEL

<u>Field work activities:</u> Mrs. Sunita Jaiswal coordinated the extension field work and following activities were conducted

Department collaborated with:

- ✓ Family service centre,
- ✓ Chuim Community Centre
- ✓ Consumer Guidance Society of India
- ✓ Bright Future NGO
- ✓ Vidyadeep community college Bharuch
- ✓ Sahavardini institute \_ Roha a Social Trust.
- ✓ Department of Life Long Learning and Extension (DLLE) University of Mumbai

<u>Family Service Centre Colaba</u>: FSC- a non- profit Organization runs family based and community Oriented programmes that aims to reach out families in difficult circumstances through preventive non- institutional services.

The various activities conducted were as Students planned activities for each session which they were going to be conducting. Such as envelope making, paper flowers, coaster making, etc. They had also planned some useful session for them such as food adulteration and English learning session.

- ✓ Orientation at the centre and Balwadi on 22/8/19. : Students had interaction with the head of the centre. They were informed about the service and how this centre works for the children and ladies for their welfare. They also discussed the activities which could be conduct for ladies in the centre. After the orientation in the centre students were taken to see the balwadi in Colaba to interact with ladies. They met the ladies and interacted with them about their interest. And what they were interested to learn.
- ✓ Envelope making on 19/9/19. Students taught them 2 different kinds of envelope. One was basic envelope and other was using different patterns. They started the session with basics i.e. using of scales. So that the concept gets clear how it works. Then the session ended with beautiful envelop works done by ladies.
- ✓ **Designing with pen on envelope on 26/9/19:** Students created and taught Mandana Motifs on the envelops which the ladies had made in the previous session. Students taught them how to decorate the envelope beautifully without much material and less effort but still attractive and beautiful. Students taught them to make design with pen on a rough paper n then on envelope. Ladies performed very well and came out with beautiful motif..

- ✓ Food adulteration session on 3/10/19: The session was taken on food adulteration to make them aware about the malpractices in the market and how harmful it is for them and how they can overcome this problem. Students demonstrated some simple home techniques to detect the adulterants. It was very interactive session .Many of them were not at all aware about malpractices and hence they were happy learning the techniques.
- ✓ Coaster making on 17/10/19: this session consisted of coaster making out of cardboard and jute. A brief introduction on what is coaster was given them. They were quite interested and wanted to learn to make this as it was a total new craft for most of them. They were quick learners and grasped the concept well and made wonderful coasters.
- ✓ **Flower making on 21/11/19.**: Paper flowers were taught. Flowers were made of different colours, the stem and leave were made out of green colour paper. Ladies where very active and they grasped it quickly and came up with different ideas.

**Bright Future NGO:** Bright Future situated in Kurla empowers youth to make informed decisions about their career and thus enables them to transform their passion into gainful employment through life skills development ,career development, mentoring support ,internships and placement opportunities. Bright Future also builds capacities of key stakeholders like parents and school who play an instrumental role in creating a conducive environment for enabling youth to take informed decisions independently pertaining to their career and life.

The different centers selected keeping in mind to the convenience of the student. The students were in the group of Five in each centers. Kurla, Bhandup (W), Kandivali. Govandi, Lower Parel, Nallasopara where the selected areas. The activities are as follows.

**22nd August 2019:** Introduction and interaction with the Centre in charge, Centre faculty and present batch students. Planning about the next week session. Joined the students in the ongoing practice session for an upcoming competition.

**29th August 2019:** Visit to 3 different banks (HDFC, ICICI and IDBI) to seek permissions with the branch managers of the banks regarding an educational visit to their banks by the students studying in Bright Future.

**12th September 2019:** Interactive session on "Financial Planning" which consisted of Introduction, steps of financial planning, about banks, money management, KYC.

**26th September 2019:** Co-ordinated, Arranged and helped the students to plan and organize the farewell party for the morning and afternoon batch students. Various activities were carried out by the students CRM students supported and helped them. The farewell party was organized well. Management skill was discussed throughout the activity.

3<sup>rd</sup> October 2019: Assessment: Conduct domain-wise assessments for the assigned batch to evaluate the level of the aspirants and support them accordingly.

17<sup>th</sup> October 2019: Placement support: Coordinate with the employer to schedule the interviews, Guest Lectures and placements etc

<u>Celebration of International Breast Feeding Week</u>: Coordinated, Guided and Organized. This year's Theme was "Empowering Parents and enabling Breast feeding now and for the Future."8 Students participated in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Mumbai Lactathon. The rally was from Matunga road to Shivaji Park. The target group was Common public, adolescent girls, lactating mothers.

The entire class of CRM also prepared posters on Importance of Breast feeding and displayed in different areas of college to create awareness amongst the college students. The beneficiaries were students of Nirmala Niketan Junior college students, Degree College and Polytechnic, along with non teaching staff, and people visiting college

Department of Life Long Learning and Extension: Coordinated with Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension, where the department took over a project under SWS which takes care of women issues. The Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension [DLLE] (known earlier as Department of Adult and Continuing Education and Extension) established on October 12, in the Year 1978 and has been recognized as a statutory Department of the University of Mumbai since 1994 to promote a meaningful and sustained rapport between the Universities and the community. Constant experimentation has enabled the DLLE to fine-tune the use of Project Work as an academic tool for the evaluation of Extension Work. Students conducted survey on Women Empowerment. And also analysed the data under the project of DLLE. 40 students were regularly guided to successfully complete the project under DLLE. Student group leader were appointed to be the mediator between the DLLE Organising team and the class students enrolled.

UDAAN The flight of extension Intercollegiate DLLE FEST: On the 30th of January 2020, the University of Mumbai had organized the Annual Extension Work Festival titled "UDAAN-the flight of Extension" at K.J.Somaiya College of Arts Commerce and Science. The Department organizes this festival in a decentralized way in Mumbai, Thane, Raigad, Ratnagiri and Sindhudurg districts during the months of January-February. The registered students of Department of Life Long Learning and Extension from various colleges come together and give Performances through Street Play and Exhibit Posters on the activities undertaken by them. The students of TY Community Resource Management had participated in this festival representing their college. All the 40 students are registered. There were total 21 students who participated in this fest for street play and poster making competition respectively. They were guided by Mrs. Sunita Jaiswal, the Head of department of Community Resource Management.2 girls Miss. Vazira Kapadia and Miss.Bhoomi Shah participated in the poster making competition and secured the 'Second place' amongst 21 colleges. The theme of the poster was 'Women Empowerment'. 15 girls participated in street play and had performed their act on women safety. They showcased how women are still ill-treated in this modern and developed world. They competed amongst 21 other colleges and enacted a fair and a good performance. It was a very wonderful experience for all the students as they got an exposure to perform on the stage and showcase their talent and compete among major colleges such as Gurunank Khalsa, SIES, Somaiya

<u>Chuim Centre Extension Activity</u>: On 23 January 2020, Thursday the TYCRM students conducted a session at the Chuim centre for the women. The session was conducted at Chuim centre, Khar road at

2:45 pm.14 women enthusiastically participated and were very eager to learn. They were divided into 2 groups with 5 in each group to teach and guide them. Immediately after introduction Students taught them how to make 2 different types of envelopes. stepwise explanation and demonstration of how to make the envelopes was conducted after which everyone made their own envelopes.

Students even taught them how to make paper bags with newspapers. All women quickly learned and easily made paper bags. Students even taught them how to decorate those envelopes and the paper bags using quilling strips and colourful papers. Different quilling methods and techniques were also demonstrated. Different designs to decorate the envelopes were discussed.

It was a very creative session for them as well as for our students. Everyone was happy to see what they made their enthusiasm to learn encouraged our students. The session concluded around 4:30pm.

**BHARUCH extension work at Vidyadeep community college** 14<sup>th</sup>, 15th 16<sup>th</sup> Oct 2019. The basic moto was to develop entrepreneurial skills amongst the student of Vidyadeep community.50 girls attended the sessions.

Activities conducted were -

- Diya painting and coaster making
- Envelopes, Varli painting and Paper quelling jewellery
- Rangoli designing and Wool garlands making

Sessions were conducted in two shifts pre luch and post lunch. The participants were very enthusiastic and were excited to start the activity; they were very creative at their work. They also came up with different designs by using different technique of painting and drew mind blowing patterns and drawings for coasters. Six TYCRM students volunteered for this community service . They came out with their own ideas of the articles to be demonstrated. The whole project was funded by the college.

Rural Camp to Roha: 10<sup>th</sup>,11<sup>th</sup>,12<sup>th</sup> Feb 20. We resided in Sahavardini institute in Roha a Social Trust. As part of extension activity and sensitizing students by exposing them to rural tribal setup Coordinated and organized Rural camp .keeping in mind the objectives such as Basic skills in the preparation and use of audiovisual aids and an exposure to different community settings and enable students to render service in these settings using various aids. The entire group of 20 students was divided into three sub groups to go to three different villages NIVI, BATSAI and TILA. Different activities were planned for school children, village women and adolescent girls and hostilities.

Activities for children: Sessions with school children consisted of: English speaking skills where names of fruits and vegetables were taught. Coloured pictures were shown, they had to identify the fruits and vegetables and name them in English. Importance of these fruits and vegetables in our diet were explained to them and how it is beneficial to our body. Colouring competition was organised where Children were provided with colouring sheets with different motifs. Crayon Colours were provided. 3 best paintings were selected for prizes. The children were very happy and enthusiastic.

**Art and craft Activity**: Children were taught different techniques of paintings such as finger painting, hand painting, leaf painting, and flower painting. Children used technique of hand painting and printed the papers. The children were enjoying the activity that they started painting their hands with the colours and helping each other. These papers were used for origami. They made Paper Boats, caps etc.

Rangeela colours and plain papers were provided to the school children. They were very creative in mixing colours and making different patterns out of their fingers and hands.

Games: Students planned a game for these children named Hatchie Sheput (Tailing the elephant). An elephant on the blackboard were sketched and the children had to stick the tail of the elephant with blindfolded eyes. Children enjoyed the game and each of them wanted to tail the elephant. The winner was gifted with a prize. CRM students had sponsored the gifts which consisted of water bottle, Tiffin box, Compass boxes etc. Second game was Bomb in the city. Names of four cities were taught to the students, the game was explained to them. Each child was very anxious to play the game. When music was played the joyfulness and anxiety was clearly shown on their faces. As the music was played the children started moving around in a circle. The winner was given a prize.

Activities for women: Demonstration of Recipes: Students demonstrated some easy and nutritious recipes with left over chapatti "CHURMA LADOO" the ingredients included were jagerry, grated coconut and ghee. The dish was not only simple and fast to make and also nutritious. Kurmura Bhel: Many of the women had not seen kurmura. We had to tell them that it is puffed rice and easily available in market and variety of dishes can be made out of kurmura. We demonstrated how to make Bhel also informed them how it's cost effective, filling and better than eating products such as Kurkure. They enjoyed the spicy tangy bhel and promised to make for their children. Some of the villagers happily volunteered in preparation by chopping vegetables. Chapatti poha: As we got the facility of using gas burners we also showed them another recipe of left over chapatti. Ladies were very eager to learn variety of dishes and thus came forward in chopping vegetables and helping the students. They all relished eating spicy chapatti Poha.

As part of entrepreneurial skills students taught them to make paper bags out of old newspapers. As plastics are now banned it becomes difficult to carry commodities in hand. Students gave them the idea of making these paper bags in bulk and selling it to the shopkeepers.

<u>Games:</u> Games were organized for the villagers thus creating good bonding amongst the students and the villagers. First game for separating the cereals in a specified time. Multi grained cereals were given to the participants .The women had to segregate each cereal and pulse And second game sticking of a bindi between the eyes on the painting with a blind fold. The ladies were very excited and enjoyed both the games Each one of them wanted to participate 3 of the women were very accurate in placing the bindis.Prizes were distributed for each games. Ladies were very happy to get the gifts .Students had sponsored saris and dress materials and various other gift items for them.
