DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

Department of Life Long Learning and Extension:

Coordinated with Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension, University of Mumbai where the department took over a project under SWS (Status of Women in Society) which takes care of women issues. The Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension [DLLE] (known earlier as Department of Adult and Continuing Education and Extension) established on October 12, in the Year 1978 and has been recognized as a statutory Department of the University of Mumbai since 1994 to promote a meaningful and sustained rapport between the Universities and the community. Constant experimentation has enabled the DLLE to fine-tune the use of Project Work as an academic tool for the evaluation of Extension Work. Students conducted survey on Women Empowerment. And also analysed the data under the project of DLLE.

48 students of the 2021-2022 batch registered for DLLE Programme. The entire project was undertaken and accomplished under the guidance of two student leaders Miss Disha Maroli and Miss Mariam Khan with Teacher Coordinator Mrs Sunita Jaiswal.

Different activities were conducted to accomplish 120 hours to attain 10 grace marks. Activities conducted were as follows:

- **Each One Teach One:**

“Each One Teach One” is a motivation for the educated class to understand their moral and social responsibility to teach at least one illiterate person, makes a big difference in society. Ever since the pandemic hit, it hasn't been easy for anyone. May it be the frontline worker or head of the department and so on? But one thing the pandemic has taught is that life is uncertain and that one can lose our loved ones in a blink of an eye. Keeping that in mind students of the T.Y.CRM department conducted an extension activity called “EACH ONE TEACH ONE”, wherein they reached out to the underprivileged parts of the society and decided to lend a helping hand. The subjects were from all across Mumbai residing near the student's locality.

The primary objective of conducting this activity was to impart knowledge through support and it is through this hands-on training and knowledge that one learns any type of skill.

As it is rightly said – “Padhega India tabhi toh badhega India” ~ Devanshi Patel. By that she meant, just taking the initiative to improve the life of just one child suffering from child labour would be more beneficial than donating something to him/her. Sure, one can be a part of many campaigns, sign on petitions, be a part of parades but how is it helping? It is through this medium that one can contribute a little towards a good cause.

Each one teach one was like a two-way street. It helped students to know their subjects well and design the pattern of study accordingly. The subjects for the activity belonged to different areas of Mumbai since students stay in different parts of Mumbai city.

The activity conducted was of 10 hours wherein the students would conduct each session of one hour each accordingly. Since everyone's target group was different, the objectives would differ depending on the subjects.

Some of the objectives included –

Incorporating low-cost nutritious recipes,

Enhancing communication skills,

Teaching entrepreneurial skills to generate income, and

Invoking consumer awareness. Menstrual health and hygiene.

Taking Basic English Grammar sessions for the kid facing difficulties, etc. After conducting these sessions, the feedback was collected.



- **National Consumer Day Celebration (Online Event)**

National Consumer Day is celebrated every year on 24th December. The theme for this year's Consumer Day was "Tackling Plastic Competition". This year we decided to celebrate it in our college as an online event on the same theme. Competitions along with quizzes and fun facts were arranged for students across various colleges.

The competitions were held before the main event. We conducted 3 intercollegiate competitions for the students. The first one was named as "Plastic Kirti" in which students had to create something best out of plastic materials. We had various entries which included things like bottle art, wall hangings, jewellery, home décor items and much more. The students had to click images of various steps and submit the images online. Another competition was poster making with topic of "Mahasagar ki Mahasamasya" in which students had to create a poster on the topic of marine pollution either handmade or digital and submit it online. And the last competition was a debate competition with the topic of "Plastic: Ek Vardhan and Abhishap" in which the students had an online debate competition. The results of the competitions were announced on the day of the main event.

On the day of the event, we started with the introduction of the college and the department. We had 2 speakers for the day who spoke on different problems related to plastic pollution. The first speaker was Ms. Sonali Chitale who is a visiting faculty in Garware Institute. She is a nature lover, a strong supporter of Mangrove forest conservation, and advocates for Sustainable Tourism. She spoke about the problems of plastic and how it affects tourism. Our second speaker was Mr. Huzefa Colombowala who is runs an IT business, but is an ocean lover and works closely with Afroz Shah for cleaning of the Versova Beach. He spoke about his journey of how he started getting involved in beach and river clean ups, and various other social works like educating people in the



surroundings about the importance of cleanliness of homes, streets, and personal cleanliness as well. Fun quiz programme was also organized for the attendees on environment, pollution and consumerism.

- **RURAL CAMP**

A. Karajgaon : Gyanajyoti Community College, located at Patilpada Karajgaon, Palghar district is managed by the Nirmala Niketan Institute. Sr. Clara Gonsalves is the in-charge of the College. The college caters to the Warli tribal youth. The Warlis are an indigenous tribe or Adivasis living in mountainous as well as coastal areas of the Maharashtra-Gujarat border and surrounding areas. They have their own animistic beliefs, life, customs, and traditions. The Warli language is a dialect spoken by this tribe.

Sixteen students and two faculty members Dr. Roopa Rao & Ms. Saniya Pai from the Department of Community Resource Management, College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan, and Mumbai – 20 visited the Gnanajyoti Community College from 23rd to 24th March 2022. The group planned and organized various skill-building as well as knowledge-filled sessions for the sixty-four students of the community college. The planning and rehearsing began on the 7th of March 2022. Marathi-speaking students from the department opted to participate and gain practical skills. Six sessions including the feedback session were planned. Students were divided into groups and each group was delegated the responsibility to handle one session each.

The group boarded the Gujarat Super-fast Express to Umbergam in Gujarat State on 23rd March 2022 at 5.45 am from Mumbai Central station. Local transportation – autorickshaw was taken to reach the interior rural area located at Patilpada, Karajgaon. The sisters (Sr. Clara Gonsalves, Sr. Shirley, Sr. Ramila Dodhia, and Sr. Mary Colaco) were very happy to welcome the group of students at 8.00 am. After breakfast, the group attended the assembly and were then taken around for a facility tour by Sr. Mary. She also oriented the group to the work of the community college.

The ‘Warli Art Centre’ located on the ground floor of the college building, provides skill-based training to the local womenfolk. It exhibits the Warli painted artifacts such as kurtas, stoles, bags, handkerchiefs, cups/mugs, and home décor accessories. Once the group settled, they started organizing the community college hall for the icebreaker session. The tables were laid, floor mats for the students were placed and the LCD projector – laptop connected. The excited group was anxiously waiting to start the session at 10.00 am.
