The session was then followed by aesthetic box packaging of articles made from coconut shells and they were provided with empty white box to test their creativity skills and they were successful in showcasing them. They drew various warli arts and designs with the colour pens which were provided. They also designed labels and delivery packets through the student's guidance. The session ended beautifully with playing games to refresh their minds and thus, this session helps them to gain extraordinary knowledge about the new trends and strategies to advertise and promote their handmade product at around 11:00am.

Next session was on Stress Management which is one of the very important topics in this competitive world. They started the session by singing a very light Marathi song "He chaal turu turu" which was really nice to start with the students explained what is stress (Tanaav)?, different types of stress and how to cope with it, was explained by showing them short videos which was fascinating for all. The session was ended with Yoga session mainly comprised of meditation and pranayama to calm down the worries, thoughts, and stress. Everyone found this session to be useful for their mental health and well-being. Around 13:20pm all of them took a lunch break and then by 2:20 they started with their next session on jewellery making out of Pop. In total there were 60 students (49 girls and 11 boys) accordingly dividend them into 5 group along with three of our volunteers in each group. At the very first they individually started with how to knead a base dough (Which was taking two table spoons of lambhi powder and 1 table spoon of glue, knead it and then mix very little amount of cooking oil). All the volunteers helped the groups divided to knead the dough and taught them technique to mould it into different shapes. Also, they provided the students with fabric colours to paint different pendants and earrings out of Pop all the students did a great job. The students were so innovative they made braided chain out of yarns provided them for the pendants also they drawn different Warli designs on pendants. The session ended at 16:40pm.

On the third day i.e. on 19th October they started around 9:30am after the delicious breakfast the feedback session was started all the students were provided with the paper to write on it and also vote of thanks was given by the students of College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan to all the staff, Sister Clara also all the students were distributed with the gifts also some students were so much enthusiastic that they stood on their own to give the feedback about the sessions and how it will help them to grow in their lives. Some students also helped sisters to get acquaint with social media and how social accounts (i.e. Instagram, Facebook) can help them to grow. Over all the visit was successfully and full of memories

Outcome of the game: Coordination is the function of management which ensures that different departments and groups work in synchronization. Therefore, there is unity of action among the employees, groups, and departments. It also brings harmony in carrying out the different tasks and activities to achieve the organization's objectives efficiently. There were 4 Winners who were awarded with gifts.

2nd game was 'complete the puzzle' Groups were made of 15 girls .Each group was provide with the pieces of puzzle which contain a part of a picture of a famous and empowered women personality. The groups had to arrange the pieces according to the picture and once done they had to speak about the personality. This game taught them not only about team work, but also Understanding and cooperation with each other. This also helped in building trust and excitement in creating new things. Well-known personalities selected were Mary Kom, Savitri Bai phule Smt. Indira Gandhi , Mother Teresa , Kalpana Chawla, Saina ,Lakshmi Bai , Lata Mangeshkar Winners were awarded and each speaker were given chocolates.

After the games everyone gathered in the room and different workshops were conducted both pre-lunch and post lunch .these workshops consisted of Gift wrapping and envelopes making, Tote bag from an old or used t-shirt workshop, bangle making from used bottles, Fancy gift wrapping. Students were accordingly divided to conduct each workshops. The subjects were also divided into smaller groups and each group were monitored by the students while making the articles. Each one came out with innovative ideas, and were very enthusiastic to learn each article. For envelop making workshop two different types of envelops with decorations were taught Tote Bag making workshop was a creative session and everyone enjoyed the session. Day 2 - 26th February 2023

First workshop was commenced with Self-defence at 7:30 am. The workshop started with some basic warm up, further continued by 3 basics punches, 3 basic blocks and 1 basic kick. After which some information about karate and self-defence were provided and 4 self-defence movements were demonstrated on subjects Shailee and Iram Asgar. And some students were called up to practice the movements. This workshop helped the students understand that how can one protect oneself in public and provided physical training. This workshop was then followed by Quilling Earrings workshop: Quilling of earing was something new, they found it enjoyable and made it happily. They divide paper strips for Quilling, earrings hooks, and varieties of decorative items. Each one of them were very energetic and creative. Each members of group made individual earrings and even helped each other.

Paper Bag Making was the next session. The bags were sturdy and fancy. It was very good. Everyone enjoyed the session and applauded.

Next session was on Personal grooming Sari draping and How to face an interview this workshop started at 1.45 pm .The personal grooming session was planned so the student of the vidyadeep community college can learn the importance of personal grooming, interview methods, importance of hygiene etc. She introduced about the hospitality industry to the students with the help of the power point. <u>Industrial visit</u> - The department of Community Resource Management organizes an Industrial visit as a part of our Value added course "Workstation Design and Applied Ergonomics". This year Industrial visit was organised to **Jaipur** from 6th March 23 to 12th March 23.20 students came for the industrial trip accompanied by Dr Roopa Rao and Ms Sunita Jaiswal.

Following Industries were visited PODAR SHOES, KAGZI PAPER, JAIPUR RUGS, HNS COACHES, and OMEGA.

Jaipur, the pink city of Rajasthan, is known for its mind-boggling tourist places and monuments like Hawa Mahal, Choki Dhani, Johri Bazar, Kishan Bagh and many more. The students of Community Resource Department from College of Home Science, Nirmala Niketan planned a life learning trip to Jaipur which included industrial visits and exciting visits to beautiful places.

The students were told to perform an ergonomic analysis of each and every industry visited with the help of ergonomic data collection tools such as workplace environment checklist, RULA, CMDQ, 3M, 5S and others. The industries visited were Podar Shoes, Kagzi Paper, Jaipur Rugs, HNS Coaches and Omega Electronics. All the industries were lacking PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) and also the raw materials weren't properly placed in the storage rooms. The hallways had obstacles which can lead accidents.

All these places were thoroughly observed and possible recommendations were provided to improve the conditions to prevent any kinds of possible circumstances or injuries. Aspects of occupational health must be considered in order to alleviate the health risks. The industrial visits enlightened

the young minds with a lot of knowledge. The students and authorities are really grateful to the industries for allowing them to conduct a recce and gain knowledge.

Other than industrial visits, the students were really elated about the Ranthambore Jungle Safari and visiting the City Palace where the royal family actually resided. The students also visited Amer Fort and enjoyed the jolly views. The shopaholics visited the Johri Bazar and were really ecstatic by seeing the Rajasthani Mojdi's and dress materials. The students are grateful to the department for providing such an opportunity which had amazing amalgamation of learning and fun activities.

Department of Life Long Learning and Extension:

Coordinated with Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension, University of Mumbai where the department took over a project under SWS (Status of Women in Society) which takes care of women issues. The Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension [DLLE] (known earlier as Department of Adult and Continuing Education and Extension) established on October 12, in the Year 1978 and has been recognized as a statutory Department of the University of Mumbai since 1994 to promote a meaningful and sustained rapport between the Universities and the community. 42 students of the 2022-2023 batch registered for DLLE Programme. The entire project undertaken was accomplished under the guidance of two student leaders Miss Deepansha Darji and Miss Hetanshee Panchal with Teacher Coordinator Mrs Sunita Jaiswal.39 out of 42 students successfully participated in the Annual Extension Activities for not less than 120 Hours related to women empowerment, entrepreneurial activities, rural camp to Bharuch and kharasgaon. Awareness workshops, and thus were awarded completion certificate.

UDAAN-ANNUAL EXTENSION WORK FESTIVAL: 28th January 2023

Every year the Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension organizes the Annual Extension Work Festival titled "UDAAN – the flight of Extension" in the months of January – February. The festival was conducted on 28th January, 2023. The objectives of the festival is to create awareness about the extension work done by the University of Mumbai through affiliated colleges in the community, about social issues through various competitions on extension work projects with the focus on College Youth and to give opportunities to the students to enhance their skills to co-relate with the new avenues in the Field of Management, Education and Entrepreneurship, in this modern technological work.

The competition categories were elocution, Powada singing, Poster making, street play presentation and creative writing.

The students of **College of Home Science**, **Nirmala Niketan from department** of **Community Resource Management** participated in the UDAAN fest for Street Play presentation, Powada singing and Poster Making Competition

1. **Poster Making:** Poster making competition was facilitated with 2 hours of time and two participants were allowed to participate for each poster from each college. The topic chosen was Women Empowerment. 21 colleges have participated in the poster making competition across Mumbai. Empowered women, empower women! The women of this society need to water each other in order to bloom together. It is a great asset for the country where women support each other and grow together in harmony. Price distribution programme was conducted and 2 students Ms.Shruti Chavhan and Ms Amna Khan won 3rd place among 21 colleges! It was a great experience and students were honoured that they got a chance to participate in the UDAAN festival.

2. Street Play Competition: The primary goal of a street play is taking a social message to a large group of people. This helps to create a sense of awareness in the society in which we live. Every street play has a specific public social theme and the actor who performed should possess the skill to exhibit and portrays the theme well. The number of participants were 15. The duration given was 5 minutes and the issue portrayed by the CRM students was Women Empowerment which included women education, women employment, women supporting for each other and women's position in every sector of society.

3. Powada Singing Competition: Powada, which means 'to glorify', is a traditional Marathi ballad that traces its history to more than 750 years. Powada is often glorified and celebrated deeds of popular folk figures and leaders such as Chhatrapati Shivaji and Tanaji Malusare, and were also written to raise awareness on social issues such as gender inequality and woman empowerment.

The duration given was 5 minutes and accepted number of participants were 10. The powada sung by the students was a tribute given to Lokmanya Tilak and his bravery to save Indians against the oppression and suppression by British's East India Company. He was one of the unsung heroes who contributed majorly towards India's freedom.

It was a great experience for students participating in UDAAN FEST. Each student was felicitated by participation certificates.

Each One Teach One:

This is a community skill where students took initiative to teach new learnings to one person who is not well educated with few basic study. The person choose was a female maid, aged 50+, she works as a household helper in houses. The allotted time duration for teaching per person was 10 hours. The plan could be adjusted according to the individuals liking. These 10 hours were divided into 5 days of work. Where each day 2 hours of learning was taught, once in the afternoon and once in the evening. Students cooperated with the subject and made the plans according to their likings.

DAY 1:22nd March 2023, Thursday, 3pm, starting with Reading and speaking of Alphabets from A to M. It was difficult for the subject at first as to pronounce few alphabets correctly. She slowly got the hang of it and read each alphabet separately once she knew which letter was what sound. This took more than an hour as the subject wanted to learn it well and improve her speaking skills. It was very interactive and fun. In the evening, it was time to do the other half that is Reading and speaking from letter M to Z. Before starting ahead with this, subjec requested to revise the previous one as to not forget the first part and she did very well. In this hour she got to get the hang of the pronunciation better and learned quicker than before

DAY 2: 26th March 2023, Sunday. Revision test of the 1st day was conducted, subject got few of them right and majority wrong so a thorough revision was taken keeping in mind that the subject practiced at least for a week. In the Evening, it was time to start with writing the alphabets from A to M. It was made sure to let the subject read and write the letters as to get better with the alphabets. She wrote down each letters 20 times and slowly and gradually there was improvement shown on each alphabets. An hour went by writing alphabets from A to M.

Day 3: 30th March 2023, Thursday. This day was Reading and writing letters from M to Z. This session was easier than the previous one as the subject got used to writing the letters easily on paper. An hour went by practicing the other half of the letters. During the evening, it was revision time for alphabets from A to Z in total small test and verbally spoke the letters and told her write the letters. At first she didn't get the letters quickly so she was made to revise the whole letters once more. She was told to keep practicing at home until she was comfortable writing without any help.

DAY 4: 2nd April 2023, Sunday. Reading and speaking 1 to 50 numbers in English. This was not too challenging for the subject, as speaking single words became easier and simpler. Numbers was suggested by the subject as she wanted to know the English version of them. In the evening, **55** | P a g e

Reading and speaking of rest of the numbers that is from 50 to 100. The session started with revision from 1 to 50 and as the subject got quite a few right she was made to revise it again so hence this session exceeded more than an hour. Lastly, 1 to 100 number revision was taken and she lastly got all of the numbers spoken rightly.

DAY 5: 4th April 2023, Tuesday. This day was for taking overall revision of all 4 days were revision for alphabets writing and reading, as well as reading and speaking numbers was taken. Revision took almost 1 hour 30 min to finally get an overall brush through of what all was learned. Revision of number was done in the afternoon and revision of alphabets was done in the evening.

Conclusion: Overall this program was very interesting and fun and the subject was very happy that student made her learn a new thing. The subject did speak that in today's society people think elderly people don't need any more learning but instead students changed that perspective for her which made the student and the subject very happy as a small help was a big help for her. The subject learned a lot from these 5 days and she mentioned that she will continue practicing until she gets it well versed.

Family Service Center: Colaba and Cuff parade –An awareness program to commemorate International Consumer Day -15th March

Family Service Center is a non – profit organization founded in 1955. They run family based and community oriented programs that aims to reach out to families in difficult circumstances through preventive non- institutional services. The programs are geared towards capacity building of community dwellers thereby enabling them to handle their own issues and concerns.

Every year Department collaborates with Family Service Center to conduct various awareness programs or skill development activities in their community centers. 15th March is used to raise awareness of global market inequities. It aims to increase awareness of consumer empowerment and their responsibility to fight for a more rapid transition to renewable energy. The major purpose of international consumer rights day is to protect consumers from unfair treatment or market exploitation that could compromise their rights. Customers are aware of their rights and how to exercise them in daily life. Jago grahak jago is a consumer awareness program launched by the department of consumer affairs under the ministry of consumer and public distributions by the government of India it started in 2005.

This year on 15th March 2022 to commemorate World Consumer Rights Day, Department conducted an awareness program in the community centers of Family Service Center at Colaba and Cuff parade. The sessions conducted were on Prevailing Malpractices in the market i.e. Food adulteration and Fake products.

Students had planned the workshop for an hour which consisted of role play, information on fake product, poster presentation and practical demonstration for better understating.

Posters were prepared on Consumer Rights, Fake products and Food Adulteration. For the better understanding students demonstrated simple tests to detect adulterants in food the tests conducted of simple home techniques and easily available material. Food products detected were Red chilly powder, Haldi powder, Coriander powder, Pepper corn. And Milk

The motive for conducting this activity was to spread awareness about the consumer rights, and various malpractices prevailing in the Indian market. Students also informed them about the government policy on consumer rights, and how food is essential for sustenance of life. We all eat food and gain energy for different metabolic activities. All living organisms need food for growth, work repair and maintaining life processes. Adulteration or contamination of natural food products is one of the major challenges in today's society. Despite various actions and penalties, the practice of adulterant is quite common in developing countries. There are various methods used for adulterating natural products.

There were total six students to conduct the activities. They were divided in 2 groups to conduct the programs in 2 different centers, Colaba and Cuff parade. It was a good experience to work in the slums of Mumbai city. The women participants were very enthusiastic and participatory.
