

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ON INTER-LIBRARY LOAN FACILITY BETWEEN

Our aim is to promote and strengthen the friendly relations and co-operation between the two institutions namely B.P.C.A.'S College of Physical Education, Wadala, Mumbai, and Nirmala Niketan Institute's College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan, Marine Lines, Mumbai and in particular in Inter-Library Loan facility for the students and staff of both the institutions. This Inter-Library Loan MOU will be functional from 1st June 2022 to 30th May 2023.

Terms for Inter-Library Loan facility:

- 1. The Chief Librarian of each institution shall be in charge of the Inter-Library loan facility.
- A refundable deposit of Rs. 2000/- (Two Thousand only) shall be charged for the Interlibrary loan facility to each party.
- 3. There shall be no Annual Fees.
- The duration of the loan of the book will be 15 days. Rules regarding the circulation of books
 will be applicable as per the library policy of the respective college from which the book is to
 be borrowed.
- 5. Each student or staff member requesting the issue of a book will be issued one book at a time.
- In case of requirement by the parental library for the issued book or journal, the same needs to be returned within two days of request.
- 7. Back issues of the magazines and journals will be available on a loan of seven days.
- 8. Textbooks, fiction, map, and digital items are excluded from the loan facility.
- Reissue of a book or journal for a second 15 days can be done through email and will be granted so long as there is no request for that resource in the parental library.
- 10. In case of damage or loss of the book, the value of the issued item shall be reimbursed to the library from which the book was borrowed by the borrowing party.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is signed on the 22nd day of October 2022 between St. Albert's College (Autonomous), Ernakulam, Kerala, India (hereinafter referred to as "ALBERTS"), represented by its Chairman, Rev. Philomena Sequeira as the second party. First party and the second party shall hereinafter gollectively be referred to as the "Parties" and individually as the "Party."

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Whereas

- ALBERTS is an autonomous college based in Ernakulam, Kerala offering 49 programs in both UG and PG and 10 research degrees.
- ALBERTS, is desirous to associate with NIRMALANIKET. AN on various areas as discussed in the purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both organizations.

Whereas

- 3. NIRMALANIKETAN is the only Home Science College affiliated to University of Mumbai where excellence is a prevailing attitude wherein it offers an education that is all inclusive irrespective of class, creed, and color. The courses presented under the umbrella of Home Science are unique and attract a lot of students of both genders.
- NIRMALANIKET AN is desirous to associate with ALBERTS, on various areas as
 discussed in the purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both
 organizations.

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That, relying on the principle of good faith, by virtue of which they will carry out all the possible actions for their due fulfillment, and relying also on their common bonds and concerns, they state their interest in strengthening their relationships through academic cooperation, and for this end they are of one accord in entering this MoU.

NOW THEREFORE THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS

ALBERTS and NIRMALANIKETHAN recognize that this collaboration would be of mutual benefit and would provide strengths in research and education and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic and industrial cooperation. As per the purpose of the said agreement, all the parties shall undertake the following activities with the approval of the authorized signatory authorities.

- 5. ALBERTS and NIRMALANIKET AN recognize that the academic collaboration would be of mutual benefit and would provide strengths in research and education and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation. As per the purpose of the said agreement, all the Parties shall undertake the following activities with the approval of the authorized signatories:
 - a) Research Collaborations: Faculty / Researchers/Students of ALBERTS and NIRMALANIKET. AN can collaborate in future research projects that either involve working cooperatively with partner institutions and/or cover a research topic with an international component. Activities include, but are not limited to, efforts toward developing proposals for collaborative research, co-authoring publication or conducting joint research projects
 - b) Faculty Exchange with Partner Universities: Faculty members of ALBERTS and NIRMALANIKET AN can travel between to participate in activities that can enhance their national / international experience and knowledge and also to foster relations between the parties. Activities include, but are not limited to, delivering lectures, teaching a course, taking a sabbatical, acquiring skills for institutional governance and developing collaborative research etc.







- c) Student Exchange with Partner Universities: Students can be given an opportunity to travel among parties to participate in activities / events that will enhance their international / intercultural experience and knowledge.
- d) Promotion of integrated studies for related studies: The parties can look at integrating an international / intercultural dimension into their teaching, research, and service functions of the university which would enable the students understanding on a global perspective.
- e) Cooperate in the exchange of information relating to their activities in teaching and research in fields of mutual interests; sharing best practices adopted by each party; sharing of e-content between the parties; access to library and repository services, if possible.
- f) Conduct cultural projects, study tours, as mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of this activity;

No Employment Relationship:

6. The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be construed in any manner as establishing any kind of partnership or bond of a labor nature between them. Thus, in all activities stemming from the present MoU and from subsequent specific action plans, the parties are in the understanding that, in all cases, employment relationships shall remain in force between the employing institution and its respective personnel.

Credits / Accreditation:

- 7. Credits and grades shall be awarded in accordance with the academic achievement policies in force at the host autonomous college/Host University. However, the home autonomous college/ Host university reserves the right to accept or reject any accreditation leading to an academic degree.
- The host autonomous college/ Host University shall issue a certification recognizing the grades obtained, as well as the hours invested or projects/papers completed by the students.

Autonomy:

This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing institutions.





Conflict Resolution:

10. Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each university. Either party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at any time.

Action Plans:

- 11. Every work program or specific activity that is agreed upon between both institutions shall be defined through an action plan, which shall be under the responsibility of two individuals, appointed respectively by each university, and which shall define the following aspects:
 - a) Foundations or considerations that warrant the plan for inter-institutional collaboration;
 - b) Objective of the action plan for inter-institutional collaboration;
 - c) General conditions of the plan;
 - d) Academic conditions of the plan;
 - e) Administrative and organizational conditions of the plan;
 - f) Duration of the protocol;
 - g) Intellectual property;
 - h) Differences between the parties;
 - i) Development of the collaboration project;
 - j) Project and/or program to be carried out;
 - k) Financial budget;
 - I) Reference to the subject of medical insurance and information.

Amendments:

12. The parties may amend or amplify this Agreement through agreements in writing to that effect. Said amendments or additions will be binding on the signatories as of the date of their signature. The parties may not assign, in whole or in part, the performance of the present MoU to any third party, except through prior and express authorization in writing by both of them. And since both parties are in agreement regarding the content of the present document, and as a token of conformity, we sign it in two counterparts, both of which will be considered originals.

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Costs

13. Each Party will be responsible for its own costs in connection with all matters relating to collaborations under this MoU. Where possible and appropriate, the Parties may also seek funding for collaborations from any research organization funding. Where applicable, the fee for services from NIRMALANIKET. AN to ALBERTS and vice-versa will be as agreed with the approvals of the signatory authorities.

Applicable Law and Jurisdiction

14. Any disputes or issues of interpretation with regard to this MoU shall be resolved amicably between the Parties. In case no amicable solution is found such disputes or issues shall be submitted to the exclusive jurisdiction of three (3) arbitrators mutually agreed by the parties. The arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in English. The seat of the arbitration shall be in a mutually agreed location. This MoU shall be governed by and construed under the laws of India and would be tried in the jurisdiction of courts in Ernakulam district.

Indemnity

15. Each Party agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other Party and their related parties from and against all liability, claims, loss, damage, and costs (including legal costs and expenses) due to its failure to perform as agreed in the MoU.

Assignment

16. Neither party will assign its rights or obligations under this MoU without the prior written consent of the other party, however such requests shall not be withheld unreasonably. This MoU will be binding upon the parties and their respective legal successors and permitted assigns.

Confidentiality

- 17. The parties agree that there is no intention to share any confidential or proprietary information in any collaboration under this MoU. If either Party wishes to disclose information it considers to be confidential or proprietary to the other Party, the Party needs to take prior written consent of the other party.
- 18. Students might be working on confidential projects and should not be disclosing any confidential information. Students cannot share data collected during the study in any





of their assignments, however are free to share their learnings without impacting confidentiality agreements with clients.

Term:

- 19. This MOU shall be effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall be automatically renewed thereafter for another five (5) years unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- 20. It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) Between

This Agreement is made on the 22nd October 2022 between St. Teresa's (Autonomous), Ernakulam, Kerala, India represented by its Principal, Dr. Alphonsa Vijaya Joseph (here In after referred to as "STC"), as the first party College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan Maharashtra, India represented by its President, Miss Philomena Sequeira (here in after referred to as "CHSC", as the second party.)

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PURPOSE

Whereas

a. St. Teresa's college established in the year 1925 at Kochi is historically placed as the first aided college for women in Kerala. It is a minority institution run by the Carmelite Sisters of St. Teresa. Our foundress Mother Teresa of St. Rose of Lima was a visionary who firmly believed that education is the most powerful weapon for empowering women and transforming society and it was with this mission that St. Teresa's College was established in Kochi. As one of the premier institutions in the domain of higher education in India, St. Teresa's College, ranked 37 by NIRF and accredited with A++ by the National Assessment and Accreditation council (NAAC). The college has over the years been inspiring young minds aimed at enhancing their leadership skills and career prospects, incorporating young women from different strata of the society to be effective partakers in the nation building process. At present, the college has 4500 students 220 teaching faculty and 80 non-teaching staff. We have 25 departments, 7 research centers. We offer 66 programmes in arts, science, commerce and management streams. The college address is Ernakulam - Park Avenue Road, 682011, Kerala, India and the college website is www.teresas.ac.in.

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b. STC is desirous to associate with CHSC on various areas as discussed in the purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both Organizations.

a) The College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan is one of the premier colleges of Home Science in India. It is the only college of Home Science affiliated to the University of Mumbai. The College has most recently been reaccredited with an A+ NAAC grade. The college is a Christian minority institution, managed by the Nirmala Niketan Institute, whose members belong to the congregation of the Daughters of the Heart of Mary.

A grant-in-aid institution, the college offers degree programmes in multiple branches of Home Science at the BSc, MSc and PhD levels. For the BSc Home Science degree, the following four branches are offered: Foods, Nutrition and Dietetics (FND); Human Development (HD); Textile and Fashion Technology (TFT); and Community Resource Management (CRM). There are five branches for MSc Home Science degree offered at the college: FND; HD; TFT; and Food Processing and Preservation; and Sports Nutrition, A PhD in Home Science is also offered with specialisations in FND, HD and TFT.

Other than the degree programmes, the college offers a range of vocational one-year Certificate, Diploma, and Advanced Diploma programmes. These are offered in the following areas: Home Science, Fashion Designing, Interior Designing, and Graphic Designing and Visual Communication. A postgraduate one-year Diploma is also offered in Dietetics and Applied Nutrition. Furthermore, there are an array of value-added and addon courses that the college offers both in-house and other students, including for nontraditional learners.

The college was started in 1955 with the inception of a certificate course in Home Science. The three-year BSc programme in Home Science, affiliated to the University of Mumbai (at the time known as the University of Bombay), was started in 1969 and two of the MSc programmes took wing in 1972 and a third in 1976. The PhD programme was begun in 1998. Two new MSc programmes were added in 2011.

The college is a leading Indian institution empowering youth, especially women, through socially-relevant and career-oriented higher education. At the BSc level the college is only for women, whilst the postgraduate programmes are open to both women and men. The

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college serves Christian students in particular, as also other students, irrespective of their religion. (www.nirmalaniketan.com)

That, relying on the principle of good faith, by virtue of which they will carry out all the possible actions for their due fulfillment, and relying also on their common bonds and concerns, they state the interest in strengthening their relationships through academic cooperation, and for this end they are of one accord in entering this MoU.

NOW THEREFORE THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS:

1. OBJECTIVE:

The parties agree that the objective of the present MoU is to establish a cooperation program in order to collaborate towards the formation of students, academics and researchers for the promotion and development of their respective areas of interest.

2. METHOD FOR ACHIEVING THE OBJECTIVES:

- To jointly propose and engage in training programmes sponsored by funding agencies, and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein
- Research Collaborations: Faculty / Researchers / Students of STC and CHSC, can collaborate in future research projects that either involve working cooperatively with partner institutions and / or cover a research topic with an international component. Activities include, but are not limited to, efforts toward developing proposals for collaborative research, co-authoring publication, conducting joint research projects, or establishing joint research centers etc.
- Faculty Exchange: Faculty members of STC and CHSC can travel between to participate in activities that can enhance their international / national experience and knowledge and also to foster relations between the parties. Activities include, but are not limited to, delivering lectures, teaching a course, taking a sabbatical, acquiring skills for institutional governance and developing collaborative research etc.
- iv. Student Exchange: Students can be given an opportunity to travel among parties to participate in activities / events that will enhance their international / intercultural experience and knowledge.
- v. Promotion of integrated studies for related studies: The parties can look at integrating an international / intercultural dimension into their teaching, research, and service functions of the institution which would enable the students understanding on a global perspective.
- vi. Cooperate in the exchange of information relating to their activities in teaching and research in fields of mutual interests; sharing best practices adopted by each party; sharing of e-content between the parties; access to library and repository services, if
- vii. Conduct cultural projects, study tours, as mutually agreed in writing between the partiesprior to commencement of this activity.

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4. FUNDING:

- a. Expenses for airfare, transportation, room and board and personal expenses of exchange students, teachers or officers shall be covered by each individual. Students will pay their registration, courses or professional practices at their home university, so that they can be recognized afterwards.
- b. Students, interns and officers shall be responsible for requesting and obtaining lodging by inquiring with the institution, which shall provide every help necessary for them to obtain safe, convenient lodging arrangements.
- e. Financial expenses for (term visits) internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution. No fees will be paid, as the assumption is that the professors / researchers remain in their positions at their home institution, which will continue to pay their salaries.

The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be construed in any manner as establishing any kind of partnership or bond of a labor nature between them. Thus, in all activities stemming from the present MoU and from subsequent specification plans, the parties are in the understanding that, in all cases, employment relationships shall remain in force between the employing institution and its respective personnel.

6. CREDITS /ACCREDITATION:

- a. Credits and grades shall be awarded in accordance with the academic achievement policies in force at the Institution/ Host University/ Government. However, the Home University/Institution reserves the right to accept or reject any accreditation leading to an academic degree.

St.Xavier's Institute of Education (Autonomous) is a Christian Minority College, established and administered by the Jesuit Mumbai Province of the Society of Jesus. The Institute acquired autonomous status from the academic year 2022-2023. It is accredited by NAAC with an 'A' grade upto 31st December, 2027.
- SXIE is desirous to associate with CHSC on various areas as discussed in the Purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both organizations.

Whereas

a) College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan, Mumbai, Maharashtra, India is one of the premier colleges of Home Science in India. It is the only college of Home Science affiliated to the University of Mumbai. The College has most recently been reaccredited with an A+ NAAC grade. The college is a Christian minority institution, managed by the Nirmala Niketan Institute, whose members belong to the congregation of the Daughters of the Heart of Mary.

A grant-in-aid institution, the college offers degree programmes in multiple branches of Home Science at the BSc, MSc and PhD levels. For the BSc Home Science degree, the following four branches are offered: Foods, Nutrition and Dietetics (FND); Human Development (HD); Textile and Fashion Technology (TFT); and Community Resource Management (CRM). There are five branches for MSc Home Science degree offered at the college; FND; HD; TFT; and Food Processing and Preservation; and Sports Nutrition. A PhD

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in Home Science is also offered with specializations in FND, HD and TFT.

Other than the degree programmes, the college offers a range of vocational one-year Certificate, Diploma, and Advanced Diploma programmes. These are offered in the following areas: Home Science, Fashion Designing, Interior Designing, and Graphic Designing and Visual Communication. A postgraduate one-year Diploma is also offered in Dietetics and Applied Nutrition. Furthermore, there are an array of value-added and add-on courses that the college offers both in-house and other students, including for non-traditional learners.

The college was started in 1955 with the inception of a certificate course in Home Science. The three-year BSc programme in Home Science, affiliated to the University of Mumbai (at the time known as the University of Bombay), was started in 1969 and two of the MSc programmes took wing in 1972 and a third in 1976. The PhD programme was begun in 1998. Two new MSc programmes were added in 2011.

- Jointly organize health awareness campaign by organizing sessions in internship schools.

4. FUNDING:

- a) Expenses for airfare, transportation, room and board and personal expenses of exchange students, teachers or officers shall be covered by each individual. Students will pay their registration, courses or professional practices at their home university, so that they can be recognized afterwards.
- b) Students, interns and officers shall be responsible for requesting and obtaining lodging by inquiring with the institution, which shall provide every help necessary for them to obtain safe, convenient lodging arrangements.
