## Highlights of 2022-2023

- First year fully offline post pandemic.
- First year of the College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan as an **integrated unit** after a long hiatus: All programmes affiliated to the University of Mumbai. New opportunities, new strengths, new challenges and related adaptation.
- **Staff cohesiveness** remained a priority.
- First year of the new **vocational/applied skills** Certificate and Diploma programmes in affiliated mode: Graphic Design and Visual Communication, Fashion Designing, and Interior Designing.

# Highlights of 2022-2023

- Junior College: Approval obtained for the new subject of Child Development for the 11<sup>th</sup> standard obtained on 19<sup>th</sup> September 2022 (retrospective from 2020-2021), approval obtained for the new subject of Child Development for the 12<sup>th</sup> standard obtained on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2023 (retrospective from 2021-2022).
- Strategic planning was reignited.
- For the first time, we hosted and organised the Zone 1 Aavishkar Research Convention in collaboration with the University of Mumbai.
- For the first time, we conducted the NEET examination on behalf of NTA, on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2023.
- UG and PG degree students of each department have presented papers at scientific competitions and conferences. Many prizes have been won by these students. (For example, 5 sets of TY CRM students won a prize at a scientific competition.)
- Teachers are recognised for their expertise by the university, regional, national and even international bodies.





## External Lens for Quality Assessment

NAAC: Reaccreditation, 4<sup>th</sup> cycle completed. In October 2021 when we received our A+ NAAC grade (CGPA of 3.33 on a four-point scale), NAAC had completed 13,316 accreditations of colleges, of which only 64 accreditations were for the fourth cycle (and none for the fifth cycle). 
