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ErgoQuest 2024: Intra-Class Research Competition

The Department of Community Resource Management at the College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan (affiliated to the University of Mumbai) hosted the inaugural ErgoQuest 2024, an intra-class research competition, on 22nd April 2024. This event marked a significant change from the traditional format of the department's research viva exam, which had been in place since the inception of the one-year add-on certificate course in 2011. With ErgoQuest, the department aimed to provide a platform for students to showcase their research endeavours more dynamically and engagingly.

All 29 students enrolled in the one-year add-on certificate course eagerly participated in ErgoQuest 2024. This enthusiastic response underscored the students' keen interest in research and academic exploration.

ErgoQuest 2024 featured a revamped format, designed to enhance student engagement and foster a culture of research excellence. The event commenced at 1:15 PM and concluded at 6:00 PM, during which seven groups of students presented their research studies. Each presentation was followed by a brief Q&A session, allowing participants to delve deeper into their findings and methodologies.

To ensure the integrity and fairness of the competition, the department invited esteemed researchers and academics to serve as jury members. Their expertise and insights played a pivotal role in evaluating the research projects and selecting the winners. Dr. Minakshi Gurav (OSD, UoM Aavishkar Committee since 2018 and Assistant Professor, Dept. of Zoology at D. G. Ruparel College of Arts, Science, and Commerce, Matunga) and Dr. Rahul Shetty (Assistant Professor at Lala Lajpatrai College of Commerce & Economics, Mahalakshmi) were the invited as jury members.

In recognition of the excellent research contributions, three cash prizes were initially designated: Rs. 3000 for the first-place project, Rs. 2000 for the second-place project, and Rs. 1500 for the third-place project. However, the jury deemed an additional consolation prize necessary to acknowledge the commendable efforts of all participants.




