

EMPLOYMENT PLACEMENT CELL ANNUAL REPORT 2023 – 24

The Employment Placement Cell (EPC) at the College of Home Science, Nirmala Niketan, is committed to offering comprehensive career development support and ensuring successful employability outcomes for our students. With the primary objective of empowering students to transition effectively from academia to the workforce, EPC continuously strives to bridge the gap between education and the professional world by enhancing students' skills, competencies, and employability.

In the academic year 2023–24, the efforts of the EPC extended far beyond facilitating job placements for graduating students. Recognizing that employability is multifaceted and dynamic, the cell adopted a more holistic approach. This approach involved imparting essential industry-relevant skills, fostering professional growth, and supporting students in achieving success in their chosen career paths. A critical focus was on equipping students with a versatile skill set that would not only help them secure job placements but also ensure that they are competitive and well-prepared for long-term success in the industries they enter.

Over the past year, the EPC organized various initiatives that aimed to meet the needs of students at different stages of their academic journey. These initiatives included skill development workshops, industry-relevant training sessions, campus recruitment drives, and informative seminars about opportunities for studying abroad. The following sections outline the activities, their outcomes, and their overall impact on the professional development and employability of our students during the 2023–24 academic year.

The Employment Placement Cell operates under the guidance and expertise of a committed team of faculty members. Their dedication and hard work ensure that EPC activities are carefully planned, executed, and aligned with the broader objectives of student development.

These members collectively took the lead in organizing and overseeing the EPC's activities, ensuring that they were designed to enhance students' skills, knowledge, and employability prospects.

Key Areas of Focus: Overview of EPC Initiatives

The activities undertaken by the EPC in 2023–24 can be categorized under three broad areas:

- Skill Development
- Recruitment/Placement
- Study Abroad Opportunities

The committee prioritized addressing the varied career aspirations of students by organizing activities that catered to both immediate employment needs and long-term career growth. The aim was to provide a platform where students could enhance their professional skills, interact with industry leaders, and explore global educational opportunities.

2.1 Skill Development Initiatives

Skill development has always been a fundamental pillar of the EPC's mission. Understanding that employers look for candidates who possess both technical expertise and soft skills, the EPC placed significant emphasis on organizing workshops and lectures to equip students with relevant and up-to-date competencies.

Throughout the academic year, the EPC facilitated multiple workshops designed to sharpen students' professional skills. These workshops were led by experts from various industries and tailored to address the specific needs of students. The following sections provide a detailed overview of the major skill development initiatives that took place during the year.

Resume Writing Workshop: One of the critical skills for securing job opportunities is crafting an effective resume that highlights a candidate's strengths and achievements. Recognizing this, the EPC organized a dedicated workshop on Resume Writing on February 26, 2024. This session was conducted by Mr. Adrian Rosario, a seasoned professional with vast experience in recruitment and career coaching. The workshop took place at Marie Adelaide De Cice Hall, and 135 students from various specializations, including Food Nutrition and Dietetics (FND), Textile and Fashion Technology (TFT), Human Development (HD), Community Resource Management (CRM), and postgraduate students, participated in the session.

The key focus areas of the workshop included:

- **Effective Resume Formatting:** Students learned how to format their resumes in a way that would be attractive to recruiters. They were guided on arranging their educational qualifications in chronological order, with emphasis on the most recent accomplishments.
- **Importance of Tailored Resumes:** Mr. Rosario emphasized the need for tailoring resumes for each job application, ensuring alignment with the job description and company requirements. This strategy significantly enhances the chances of securing an interview.
- **Content Structuring:** The participants were provided with insights into structuring their resumes effectively, including sections on educational qualifications, internships, skills, hobbies, co-curricular activities, and leadership experiences.
- **Soft Skills and Interests:** Students were encouraged to include relevant interests and hobbies that reflect their soft skills and personality traits. These elements offer employers a glimpse into the candidate's ability to adapt, lead, and collaborate within diverse work environments.



The session proved to be immensely beneficial, as students gained practical knowledge on how to present themselves on paper effectively. Several students reported a marked improvement in their resume-writing skills, and this was reflected in the high level of engagement during the recruitment drive later in the year.

Interview Facing Skills Workshop

On March 11, 2024, the EPC organized a workshop on Interview Facing Skills, conducted by Mr. Adrian Rosario. This session was aimed at equipping students with essential interview

skills, preparing them for the various challenges they may encounter during the interview process. A total of 95 students participated, and the session focused on critical areas such as:

- **Pre-Interview Preparation:** Emphasis was placed on thorough research about the company, the job role, and the industry. Students were advised to prepare and organize key documents in advance, including multiple copies of resumes and mark sheets.
- **Body Language and First Impressions:** Mr. Rosario underscored the importance of body language, eye contact, and the initial introduction during interviews. First impressions play a crucial role in determining interview outcomes, and students were given practical tips on how to project confidence and professionalism.
- **Handling Common Interview Questions:** The workshop covered strategies for answering typical interview questions, such as "Tell me about yourself," "What are your strengths and weaknesses?" and "Why do you want to work for this company?" Students were encouraged to practice delivering concise, well-structured responses that reflect their preparation and understanding of the role.
- **Mock Interviews:** The session included mock interviews, which allowed participants to simulate real interview scenarios. These practice sessions provided students with a platform to apply the skills they had learned, while also receiving constructive feedback on areas of improvement.



By the end of the session, students reported increased confidence in facing interviews, and many felt that the insights gained would significantly enhance their performance during future recruitment processes.

Placement Activities

On October 6, 2022, fifteen students from the T.Y. B.Sc. CRM program's Hotel Front Office & Housekeeping elective to apply for opportunities through the Oberoi Central Employment Register (OCER) and the Oberoi Centre of Learning and Development (OCLD). OCER is The Oberoi Group's recruitment platform for positions in departments like Food and Beverage, Front Office, Housekeeping, and Sales. OCLD, established in 1966, offers a prestigious two-year postgraduate management program with rigorous selection starting annually in September.



The selection process involved five stages, beginning with a recruitment presentation, followed by self-introductions, extempore rounds, interviews, aptitude and psychometric tests, and trade tests for kitchen applicants. Of the fifteen students, seven advanced to the next stage: Ms. Kameswari Ushasree, Ms. Amithi Jawalekar, Ms. Asmita Birwatkar, Ms. Akanksha Sharma, Ms. Aafiya Shaikh, Ms. Charisma Thampy, and Ms. Rashida Badri. They completed an online psychometric test, panel interviews via MS Teams, and in-person interviews at The Trident Hotel in Mumbai.



The final selections were Ms. Ushasree and Ms. Jawalekar as Front Office Associates, Ms. Thampy and Ms. Shaikh as HR Associates in Learning & Training, Ms. Sharma as an HR Associate, and Ms. Badri as a Sales Associate. These outcomes demonstrate the students' success and the excellent guidance provided by their faculty.

Campus Recruitment Drive: Exploring Employment Opportunities

The highlight of the EPC's activities this academic year was the Campus Recruitment Drive 2024, which took place over five days between March 30th and April 4th, 2024, with an additional day on May 1st, 2024. The recruitment drive aimed to create a platform where students could interact with potential employers and secure job offers.

A total of 15 companies, representing diverse sectors including multinational corporations, startups, and local businesses, participated in the recruitment drive. 76 students actively participated in the recruitment process.

Before the recruitment drive, the EPC conducted preparatory sessions to ensure students were well-prepared for the recruitment process. These sessions focused on resume building, interview preparation, and mock interviews, which enabled students to refine their skills and approach the recruitment drive with confidence.

Companies that participated in the recruitment drive included K11 School of Fitness Sciences, Zee Learn, Novus Life Sciences Pvt Ltd, Lifeness Science Institute, The oberoi Hotels, and others. The recruitment drive witnessed a significant increase in the number of job offers compared to the previous academic year, reflecting the effectiveness of the EPC's efforts in enhancing students' employability. The success of the drive can be attributed to the meticulous planning and skill development initiatives that had been conducted throughout the year.

Study Abroad Opportunities

In addition to supporting students in securing local job placements, the EPC also organized sessions focused on providing information about study abroad opportunities. The objective was to help students broaden their horizons and explore options for pursuing higher education in foreign countries.

One of the key initiatives in this area was the Education Fair organized by Envision India on September 3, 2023, at Novotel, Mumbai. Ten students from the Community Resource Management (CRM) department participated in this fair, which aimed to provide comprehensive guidance on studying abroad. The fair featured representatives from universities in countries such as the UK, USA, Australia, Canada, Germany, Singapore, and Switzerland.

During the event, students were able to:

Interact with representatives from leading international universities.

- Gain insights into the admission processes, scholarships, and financial aid options available for international students.
- Learn about specific requirements and procedures for applying to graduate programs, including documentation, language proficiency exams, and visa procedures.
- Attend informative sessions about the cost of living, accommodation options, and cultural aspects of studying in foreign countries.

This initiative proved to be a valuable resource for students who were considering further education abroad, as it provided them with critical information and opened doors to new opportunities. Several students expressed interest in pursuing higher education overseas, and the EPC continues to support their aspirations by providing guidance on application processes and connecting them with alumni who have pursued education abroad.

Challenges and Opportunities

While the academic year 2023–24 was marked by numerous successes, the EPC also encountered certain challenges. One significant challenge was adapting to the rapidly changing demands of the job market, especially in light of emerging technologies and industries. To address this, the EPC recognizes the need to continuously innovate its offerings by introducing programs that focus on newer skill sets such as digital literacy, data analytics, and project management.

In addition, while the campus recruitment drive yielded positive results, a broader pool of recruiters from different sectors could further enhance the range of job opportunities available to students. The EPC plans to expand its network of industry contacts and engage more recruiters from various domains in the coming year.

Future Directions

As the EPC looks toward the future, it is committed to building on the success of the past year and addressing the challenges that remain. Plans for the next academic year include:

Expansion of Industry Collaborations: The EPC will work to establish new partnerships with companies and industries that align with the diverse academic disciplines at the College of Home Science. By fostering relationships with a wider range of employers, students will have access to a more extensive array of job opportunities.

- **Introduction of Digital Skills Training:** Recognizing the increasing demand for digital competencies, the EPC aims to introduce workshops on emerging technologies, digital marketing, data analysis, and other fields that are rapidly growing in importance across industries.
- **Enhanced Study Abroad Support:** The EPC will continue to expand its efforts to support students interested in pursuing higher education abroad by offering personalized counseling, application assistance, and financial planning resources.
- **Increased Focus on Internship Opportunities:** In addition to job placements, the EPC plans to place greater emphasis on internships and experiential learning opportunities, as these provide students with valuable real-world experience that enhances their employability.

The EPC's multifaceted approach to career development has had a tangible impact on the professional growth of our students.
