They are the recipient of Ahilyadevi Holkar Award for recognition of their contribution and achievements in the field of Women & Child Development. Ms Sheetal Rebello, is Deputy Director, Family Service Centre, working with FSC for 13 years

Students from the Community Resource Management Department, wanted to make sure that the community understands why breastfeeding is important. Students visited two different centres on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2023 in Colaba and Cuff Parade, guided by two volunteers. Students presented their posters and the street play called Nukad Natak. The street play was performed not only in the centre hall but also outside the centres, and that turned out to be a super hit. It was a great experience, and student were happy with their efforts and thus resonated with the community. Sharing important info about breastfeeding through posters and Fun Street plays felt like a success for all of our students.

#### ➢ Workshop On Gas Safety 2023 IN Collaboration with Bharat gas - August 23, 2023

Bharat Gas, as a major distributor in both residential and commercial sectors, plays a crucial role in facilitating the Direct Benefit Transfer of LPG. This initiative aims to provide subsidies directly to the bank accounts of eligible LPG consumers, ensuring transparency and efficiency in the distribution process. With its extensive network and infrastructure, Bharat Gas has been instrumental in implementing this program and ensuring that the benefits reach the intended beneficiaries.

On January 24, 1976, Bharat Refineries Limited, a 100% public sector enterprise, made a significant acquisition by acquiring Burmah Shell's interests in India. This acquisition included a large refinery and a nationwide marketing organization, which further strengthened Bharat Gas's position in the market. With this expansion, Bharat Gas was able to enhance its production capacity and improve its distribution network, ensuring a steady supply of LPG to its customers across the country.

In addition to its distribution activities, Bharat Gas has also been actively involved in promoting consumer safety. One such initiative was the Gas Safety workshop conducted at the College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan on August 23, 2023. This workshop was organized in collaboration with Bharat Gas and aimed to educate SY BSc students about the importance of gas safety and the measures they can take to prevent accidents.

During the workshop, Ms Rashida Amir, a representative from Bharat Gas, introduced the first safety gas pipe and highlighted the partnership between Bharat Gas and the Colaba Gas Service Centre. The session covered various topics related to gas safety, including preventing gas leaks and explosions, consumer rights, gas cylinder information, online payment methods, accident prevention, regulator safety, and delivery inspection. The workshop was designed to be interactive and informative, with a quiz held at the end to engage both students and teachers. Prizes were awarded to those who answered the questions correctly, further incentivizing participation and learning.

Students, staff and Management of Gnanajyoti Community College visited College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan where students of Community Resource Management welcomed them, oriented them about the department, courses offered and the career opportunities. The collaboration between the CRM students and the visiting students from Kharasgaon allowed for a fruitful

exchange of knowledge and skills. The hands-on activity of creating pouches using canvas cuttings and paints not only showcased the students' artistic talents but also taught them important aspects of costing, pricing, and marketing.

The workshop not only provided a creative outlet for the students but also introduced them to potential career paths in community resource management. By the end of the session, the students from Kharasgaon expressed their gratitude for the opportunity and left with newfound skills and knowledge. The workshop served as a valuable learning experience for all participants, highlighting the importance of practical, hands-on activities in education. The Department of Community Resource Management at Nirmala Niketan's College of Home Science continues to provide such opportunities for students to enhance their skills and explore potential career paths in the field.

#### ➢ Workshop on "Food Adulteration" and Fake Products- August 12<sup>th</sup> 2023

Consumer Awareness Program on "Food Adulteration and Fake Products" was conducted on August 12<sup>th</sup> 2023Resource person was Mr. Gajanan Patil from Jago Grahak Jago also worked for Consumer Guidance Society of India since 30 years. He has delivered lectures on the critical issue of food adulteration, its causes, consequences, and possible solutions. This session was attended by TY CRM students and faculty member. The session addressing "Food Adulteration and Fake Products" had a dual focus: providing knowledge and hands-on experience to raise awareness about the critical issue of food adulteration. The primary objective was to highlight the escalating concern surrounding food adulteration and suggest practical measures to alleviate its adverse effects on public health and safety.

Food adulteration, the act of introducing substandard, harmful, or less expensive substances into food items, jeopardizes their quality and safety. This unethical practice not only poses severe health risks but also undermines the integrity of the entire food industry. The trainer delved into the Causes of Food Adulteration, citing economic gain as a significant factor—adulterants are often cheaper, boosting manufacturers' profits. Weak enforcement of food safety regulations, supply chain complexities, and consumer demand for lower prices were also identified as contributors. To combat food adulteration, the session stressed the importance of regular testing of food products to identify adulterants and punish offenders. Additionally, consumer education plays a pivotal role in raising awareness about the dangers of consuming adulterated food and encouraging informed choices

Consuming adulterated food can lead to various health risks such as food poisoning, allergies, organ damage due to chemical contaminants, and long-term health effects from the consumption of inferior quality or nutritionally deficiency food.

He also gave an in-depth information regarding The weight block, the weighing scale, the measuring tape electronic measuring scale which should have government sign and also about their expiry dates. The attendees were given hands-on experience on how to check fake products through certain experiments. The first experiment was on tea crumbs where he soaked the paper in water and then sprinkled the tea crumbs on soaked paper, as soon as the adulterated tea crumbs were sprinkled on wet paper it released the colour on paper the original one didn't release any colour which showed the difference between fake and the original one. Same way the other experiment we did was with an haldi powder where he mixed haldi powder in water and as soon as he added few drops of lime it changed its color to red - a signs of adulterated masala, and so he experimented with other food materials which made us realize how harmful it is and we use it in daily life so how should we actually be safe by those products.

In conclusion, the session underscored that food adulteration is a pressing issue with far-reaching consequences for health and well-being. Collaborative efforts among governments, regulatory bodies, food manufacturers, and consumers are crucial to prevent and eliminate food adulteration. Strict

regulations, robust testing procedures, and enhanced consumer awareness are essential pillars to ensure the production and consumption of safe, nutritious, and unadulterated food products.

The highly interactive nature of the session encouraged attendees to ask questions and actively participate in discussions, fostering a dynamic learning environment. Participants gained valuable skills and knowledge applicable to their daily lives, empowering them to make informed choices and contribute to a safer food ecosystem.

#### 2. OCLD/OCER:

On **6th October 2022**, under the motivation and guidance of **Dr. Roopa Rao**, 15 students from the **Hotel Front Office & Housekeeping elective** (T.Y. B.Sc. CRM) were being encouraged to apply for recruitment through the **Oberoi Central Employment Register (OCER)** and the **Oberoi Centre of Learning and Development (OCLD)**. These prestigious programs offer career opportunities with The Oberoi Group, one of the most renowned hotel chains in India.

The OCER recruitment process, conducted annually at The Oberoi, Mumbai, focuses on hiring for positions like Operations Assistant in various departments, including Food and Beverage Service, Front Office Operations, Housekeeping Operations, Kitchen Operations, and Sales. Similarly, the OCLD, established in 1966, offers a two-year postgraduate management program in Guest Service, Housekeeping, Kitchen Management, and Sales. OCLD is considered one of Asia's premier management training programs, setting a benchmark for excellence within the hotel industry. Out of the 15 students who applied this year, the selection process involved five rigorous stages:

- Stage 1: A Recruitment Presentation followed by a Q&A session.
