WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY

PLANT TODAY FOR A GREENER TOMORROW

The workshop was conducted by environment expert and environment consultant Ms. Rashmi Joshi.

The aim of the workshop was to encourage students to plant trees and contribute to local reforestation efforts fostering a sense of responsibility towards environmental conservation within the community and to promote Seed Ball Making so as to educate participants on the benefits and techniques of creating seed balls for easy planting.

About Fort : Rohida Fort / Vichitragadh Fort is a fort located 20 km from Dhule, Pune district, of Maharashtra. This fort is an important fort in Pune district. This fort was built during Yadava period. According to the inscription on the third gate, Muhammad Adil Shah of Bijapur had captured this fort on May 1656. Rohida was among the 23 forts Shivaji handed over to Mughals during the Treaty of Purandhar (1665). On 24 June 1678, this fort was again captured by Shivaji. Karveji Dalhe had patronage over the entire other state and half of the Rohida Fort along with some patches of land. The Mughals captured the fort later on. This fort was under the control of Patawarke of Bhor State, until India's independence.
