#### Purpose of MoU

Recognizing the mutual benefits to be gained through a co-operative programme promoting research and other scholarly collaborations, Jai Hind College (JHC) and College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan (CHSNN) enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). This MOU will involve and benefit all four departments of the College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan viz; Foods, Nutrition and Dietetics: Human Development; Textile and Fashion Technology; Community Resource Management; & all Departments of Jai Hind College with special focus on Departments of Microbiology, Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry and Psychology. The activities so conducted could be subject-based or to do with imparting life skills. The charges for the activities so conducted by either of the institutes will be borne by the student /stakeholders of each institution.

This MOU envisages the following objectives:-

- 1) Strengthening knowledge and other affiliated competencies of the students: Faculty and alumni stakeholders of both institutions will accomplish this objective through organisation of seminars, workshops, webinars and lectures/lecture series and short-term courses. The courses will be designed in such a way as to provide new perspectives, additional learning of congruent or allied fields to enhance competencies. The courses will have an evaluation model to ensure comprehensive and effective learning. These programmes will provide a participation certificate or a course completion certificate.
- 2) Collaboration for teaching learning partnerships to deliver inputs into advanced ideas, content and techniques for students, alumnae and faculty stakeholders, for both institutions based on the expertise available.
- 3) Infrastructural intersections: Both institutions will favourably organize the access to use facilities of each other by students and faculty stakeholders at the agreed discounted financial terms and conditions. This could pertain to laboratories, library and resource materials.

- 4) Research and consultancy intersections: Faculty of both institutions can be the guide or co-guide for research projects at the undergraduate and /or postgraduate levels; as well as take up project consultancies based on faculty expertise.
- 5) Focus on creation of interdisciplinary knowledge: Activities can be organized that are interdisciplinary in nature and promote the culture of holistic and life-oriented learnings and research, with due acknowledgement of concerned teachers and of the two institutions.
- 6) Focus on innovation, collaboration and entrepreneurships: Both institutions can either jointly or parallelly collaborate for each Institution's Innovation Cell as well as in promoting the culture of entrepreneurship by organizing programmes, collaborative projects with a potential for being converted to prototypes. Faculty of each institute can also act as mentors for such purpose, with due acknowledgement of concerned teachers and of the two institutions.
- 7) Student exchange: The exchange of students for intellectual exploration and broadening of academic and research perspectives can be organized by both the institutions. The number of students and the duration will be selected by mutual agreement between both the institutions. The host institution will evaluate an exchange student's performance in each course or module and award credits to that effect.

#### Duration and termination of MoU

- This MoU shall become effective from the date it is signed by both parties and shall be valid for period of three years but may be renewed or extended by mutual consent expressed in writing.
- Any changes to the MoU shall be subject to written consent by both the parties.
- This MoU may be terminated by either party at any time provided that the terminating party gives a written notice of its intention at least six months prior to termination.

- Differences between the parties;
- · Development of the collaboration project;
- · Project and/or program to be carried out;
- · Financial budget;
- Reference to the subject of medical insurance and information

#### 12. CONFIDENTIALITY:

x) Each of the parties accepts and declares that every information from the other party is of a confidential nature, is the exclusive property of the latter and has been or will be disclosed to the former solely with the purpose of enabling the full accomplishment of the present Agreement. For this reason, every piece of information provided by one party to the other before signing this Agreement and/or during its performance must be kept confidential and therefore may not be disclosed to any third parties.

#### 13. AMENDMENTS:

y) The parties may amend or amplify this Agreement through agreements in writing to that effect. Said amendments or additions will be binding on the signatories as of the date of their signaguyer The parties may not assign, in whole
