to harmonizing built and natural environments was evident. She inspired students to consider sustainability and ecological impact in design, highlighting the importance of responsible design practices.

These sessions provided invaluable industry insights, exposing students to diverse career pathways and the realities of the design profession. Alumnae shared both technical advice and personal stories, creating a relatable and motivational environment for current students.
