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#### Report

The workshop was taken on Highlights of NEP-2020 based on the School Connect 2.0 Campaign for students of Junior College. The workshop aimed at introducing and discussing the highlights of NEP-2020 for the students that they will benefit from after they enter Higher Education. Then principal of College of Home Science Nirmala Niketan, Dr. Asha Mathew interacted with the students and prepared them for the information on NEP-2020 that they were about to receive, and introduced the resource person, Prof Dr. Shaukat Ali, University of Mumbai appointed resource person and Principal at, Akbar Peerbhoy College of Commerce.

The workshop began with Prof .Dr. Shaukat Ali introducing the topic to the students. He emphasised on the key features under NEP 2020 like flexible learning pathways via several course combinations and durations for UG and PG programs, multiple entry-exit points, skill and vocation oriented education, government schemes offered to students in fostering multidisciplinary education, Academic Bank of Credits, digital learning sources, holistic education and equity-inclusion.

He explained the highlights of students being able to take up multiple education pathways (e.g., integrating sports, arts, and science disciplines), having support for re-entering academics after life interruptions (e.g., financial responsibilities, loss of a parent), being able to choose innovative combinations of major and minor subjects for holistic learning. He emphasised on the flexibility that NEP-2020 education and also explained the concept of



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Academic Bank of Credits. The different initiatives by the Government of India like National Apprenticeship Training Scheme (NATS) which offers stipend support for hands-on industry training focused on bridging education and employment gaps, SWAYAM and SWAYAM+ which are the online platforms offering credit-earning courses aligned with UGC norms, PM Vidyalakshmi Scheme was described which offers collateral-free education loans with interest subvention for eligible students. He then explained how NEP-2020 education shall be promoting research, entrepreneurship, and employability through collaborations with industry. The key mention was about introduction of SATHEE (Self-Assessment, Test, and Help for Entrance Examinations) for personalized guidance.

The workshop emphasized the transformative impact of NEP-2020 on Indian education, providing students with greater flexibility, revised UG/PG frameworks with opportunities for major, minor, and vocational courses, inclusivity and integration of co-curricular and interdisciplinary components rendering opportunities for holistic growth. This is backed up by government initiatives which will ensure financial support, skill development, and employability, thereby preparing students for a dynamic future.
